New Business	<p><b>Every Child by Two- Call to action:</b> is asking us to add our name to Every Child by Two's Vaccine Funding support statement to ensure that legislators reallocate fund when the Affordable Care Act gets repealed. Everyone from the Coalition is asked to participate by going to the Every Child by Two website and add your name.</p> <p><b>CDC Champion Award:</b> nominations are due by February 3, 2017. Coalition had a submission and winner last year, so have no plans to submit for this year.
