Historical Society Historian Roberta Vincent The year is 1822. Alden is still part of the Town of Clarence, although no longer in Niagara County, but in the new Erie County. The act of the New York Legislature to separate the towns of Alden and Erie (Newstead) from Clarence would not be passed until March 27, 1823.

Alden was known as Alden in the legislation, so the town meeting to select a name, had already taken place. The Town of Erie would decide to change its name to Newstead because of confusion with a former town named Erie, and because some of their mail was being sent to Erie, Pennsylvania. Unable to decide upon a name, they turned the decision over to Millard Fillmore, then a representative in the New York Assembly. Fillmore in turn consulted with his wife who suggestion "Newstead" after poet Lord Byron's ancestral home in England. (The act to change the name passed in April 1831.)

It is difficult to determine the population of Alden in 1822, as both the 1820 and 1830 federal censuses include Alden in Clarence. The 1840 census appears to be clearly Alden with a population of 2129; 1101 males, 1028 females. Those under the age of 20 number 1144, age 20 and above number 985. The population for 1822 would most likely be less as there would be settlers moving in during those 18 years between 1822 and 1840, although there was also movement west to Michigan, Illinois and other Midwestern states.

The first frame house is being built in the village; all the rest are log cabins, with some improvements from those early 1810-1812 cabins. The same is true for the areas outside the village. The Willis and Webster families in the Town Line area have been joined by other settlers. Both Nathan Willis and John Webster have sawmills on Cayuga Creek.



In Alden Center (Sandridge) John C. Rogers has built a grist mill near his sawmill on Eleven Mile (*Ellicott*) Creek. Amos Herrick has purchased a large tract of land near the Rogers mill and has moved from Clarence, having to cut his own road a considerable portion of the way. A.C. Burdick has settled in the area called West Woods (*Westwood Road*), as has Stephen Church.

The first house has been built in Millgrove by Moses Case from Onondaga County. Jonas Van Wey moved into the area about the same time. There are just a few houses in the Crittenden area, one belongs to Edmond Badger (elected Supervisor in 1823).

The only congregation in town is the Presbyterian Society having been organized in 1813. They are still meeting in the schoolhouse in the village. There is a doctor now, John Harrington; also a store, run by Calvin Bishop, Seth Estabrook having closed his store on Mercer (*Sullivan*) Road a few years ago. Amos Bliss's tavern east of the village has also closed. There is still no post office. We must go to Clarence to get our mail. We have to go to Clarence, too, for Town meetings.

Thomas Farnsworth from Vermont has started the first industry in town, a tannery. It is located on Spring Creek along the road to the north.. Farnsworth is the man building the frame house in the village. He has purchased 206 acres in the village from Aaron Bunce and has a large farm.

More people have died and been buried in the Village (*Evergreen*) Cemetery since the first burial of John Carl Kranske in 1813. Among them are Elvira Dayton, infant daughter of William and Ruth Dayton; William Eels, infant son of Tercius and Mary Eels; Capt. Joshua Hendee, Revolutionary War veteran; Bird Cook, husband of Mary; and Oliver Udell, husband of Lucinda.

Our roads are unpaved, muddy in the spring and best traveled in the winter when snow fills in the holes and ruts. There are only 6 "streets" in the village—Church St. (1820), West Main (1817), State Road (*Broadway*), Buffalo St. (*Broadway*), North St. (*Crittenden St.*), and the Alden-Cowlesville Rd. (*Exchange St.*).

In the township there are Cayuga Rd. (*Broadway*) (1815) leading to Lancaster; Crittenden Rd. (1820) from Crittenden to Newstead, surveyed by Edmond Badger; Billo(w) Rd. (1812); Buckwheat Rd. (1816); County Line Rd. (1820) south of the State Road surveyed by Edmond Badger, north of the state road (1816); Buffalo-Batavia Rd. (*Genesee St.*) (1810); Henske Rd., Sullivan Rd. to County Line Rd.(1816); Millgrove-West Alden Rd. (*Sandridge Rd.*) (1816); North Millgrove Rd. (1817); North Rd. (1820); Rundel Rd. (1821); Siehl Rd. (1819), surveyed by Edmond Badger; Sullivan Rd. (1813); Townline Rd. from Westwood to Genesee (1819), surveyed by Edmond Badger; West Alden Rd. (*Cayuga Creek Rd.* (1816).); West Main St. (1817); and Westwood Rd. (1819), surveyed by Edmond Badger. Some of the longer roads have been added in sections as easements have been gained.

Two of the newest settlers have arrived, all the way from New Hampshire, Seth Estabrook's in-laws, Moses and Hannah Alden Hebard. Ol' Moses looks frail, but Hannah is small and feisty, just like our town that bears her name.

## County Historian Presents Top 10 Moments





## "The Grove"

On June 9, Alden Town and Village Historian and Historical Society Archivist Karen Muchow gave a presentation on the history of "The Grove," more commonly known as bandstand park, but officially named Alden Firemen's Park since 1987.

The land for the park was donated to the town by Thomas Farnsworth, Sr., who purchased 230 acres of land in Alden when he moved here from Vermont in 1821. Surrounded by homes and businesses, the park has served as a hub for village/town activities, hosting art shows, chicken barbecues, Memorial Day and Veterans' Day observances, Christmas in the Park festivities, Grange Fairs, Halloween Spooktaculars, July 4th celebrations, band concerts, and many other events.



The bandstand was erected in 1935 as a memorial to those who served in WW I. During WW II, commemorative wooden slats identifying the names of all those who served from Alden and surrounding communities were posted on the bandstand, which still serves as a gathering spot for community events today. in the future!




