The following concerns/statements were voiced:

• Why is the Village of Alden, Hook & Ladder, not included in these negotiations?

- Why was the meeting moved to 11am on a Monday?
- Increase in cost of homeowners insurance is a concern
- The Board was questioned if they had ever experienced a house fire?
- Questioned why the boundary line agreement was decided upon by the Town Board, when historically the fire companies have made that decision
- How many homes are in each district?
- Questioned continuance clause not included in contract
- What happens if an agreement is not reached with Hook & Ladder?
- Does the Board negotiate with Lancaster for Townline VFD or Townline VFD?
- What is the relationship between the Board and Hook & Ladder?
- Are all volunteer fire companies audited?
- Why is this happening now?
- What are the improprieties of Hook & Ladder that continue to be mentioned?
- How much will the Crittenden substation cost?

Residents asked the Board not to approve the three contracts until all four could be decided on. They requested a public hearing be held for all four in the evening when more people can attend. Councilwoman Waiss assured those present that the next public hearing will be held in the evening. Supervisor Adamski stated negotiations are still ongoing with Hook & Ladder. He also addressed the substation for Crittenden being included in the contract was an error and it will be struck from the contract.

Councilwoman Pautler motioned and Councilwoman Waiss seconded the motion to leave the public hearing; all were in favor.

WHEREAS, the Town of Alden is eligible for funding from the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds of H.R. 1319 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("CSLRF");

WHEREAS, before receiving a payment, the Town Board is required to formally accept the CSLRF funds;

WHEREAS, revenue received under the CSLRF must only be spent for purposes authorized by the CSLRF, and applicable regulations, and by state law;

WHEREAS, revenue received under the CSLRF must be accounted for in a separate fund and not co-mingled with other revenue for accounting purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Alden must comply with all applicable budgeting, accounting, contracting, reporting, and other compliance requirements for CSLRF funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS THAT:

1. The Alden Town Board hereby accepts and requests CSLRF funding; and

2. The Town of Alden affirms that the CSLRF revenue will only be used for the purposes prescribed in the CSLRF, and in US Treasury guidance in 31 CFR, Part 35, and any applicable regulations, and in accordance with state law; and

3. The Town of Alden will comply with procedures created by the State of New York and the US Treasury Department to receive funds under the act; and

4. The Town of Alden will account for CSLRF in a separate fund and not co-mingle it with other revenues for accounting purposes and will comply with all applicable federal and state budgeting, accounting, contracting, reporting, and other compliance requirements for CSLRF funds; and

5. The Alden Town Board designates and directs the Supervisor to take all actions necessary on behalf of the Town Board to receive the CSLRF funds.

6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
