COVID-19 Data Update

Week ending March 19, 2022

All data are provisional.

501 new COVID-19 cases were recorded for the week ending March 19. This is a 12% increase compared to the previous week (447 cases) - the first weekly increase following nine consecutive weeks of decline. These data do not include at-home tests.

The weekly COVID-19 positivity rate was 2.3%, up from 2.0% the previous week. This is the first weekly positivity rate increase in 10 weeks.

Overall COVID-19 diagnostic tests totaled 22,106, nearly the same as the previous week's total of 22,407 tests.

7-day case rate per 100,000 persons was 53, up from 47 for the previous week.

Buffalo city COVID-19 cases comprised ~32% of new COVID-19 cases this past week (Buffalo city population is 29.2% of all Erie County residents).

The ZIP code 14221 had the highest number of reported COVID-19 cases, at 29 cases. Only two ZIP codes in Erie County had a case rate higher than 100 per 100,000 persons over seven days: 14222 and 14072.

Confirmed COVID-19 Cases by Age Group and Gender (March 2020-present)

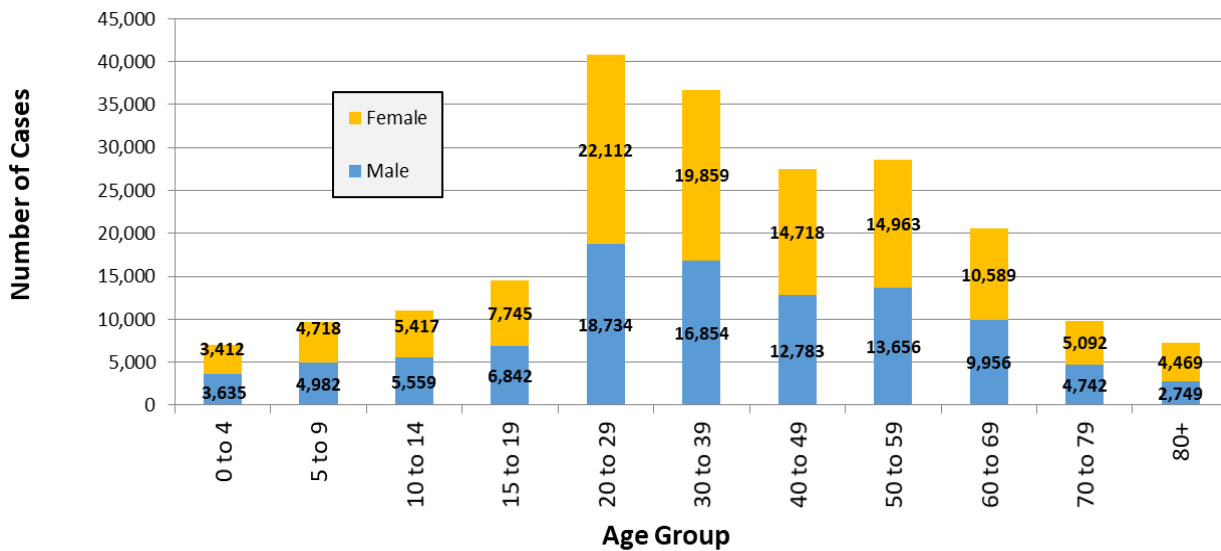

Confirmed COVID-19 Cases by Age Group (March 13-19, 2022)

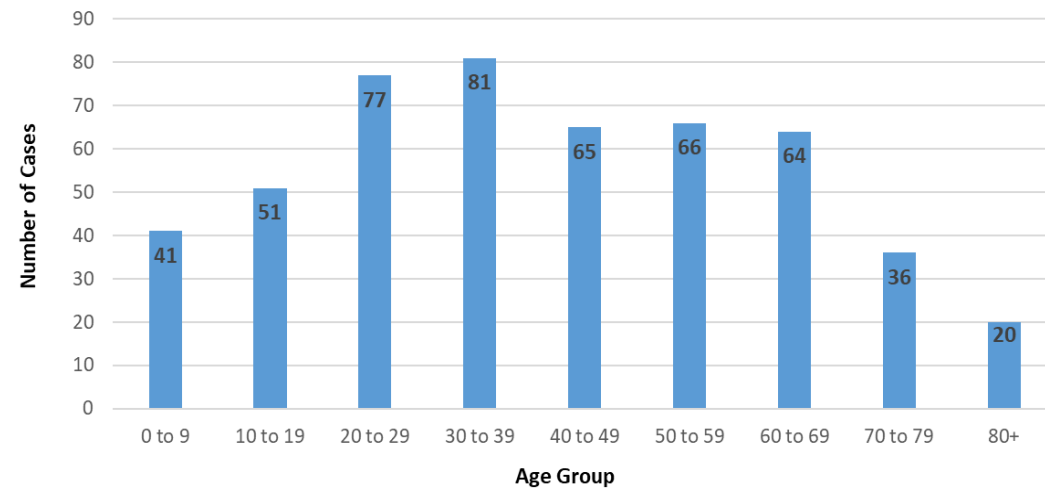

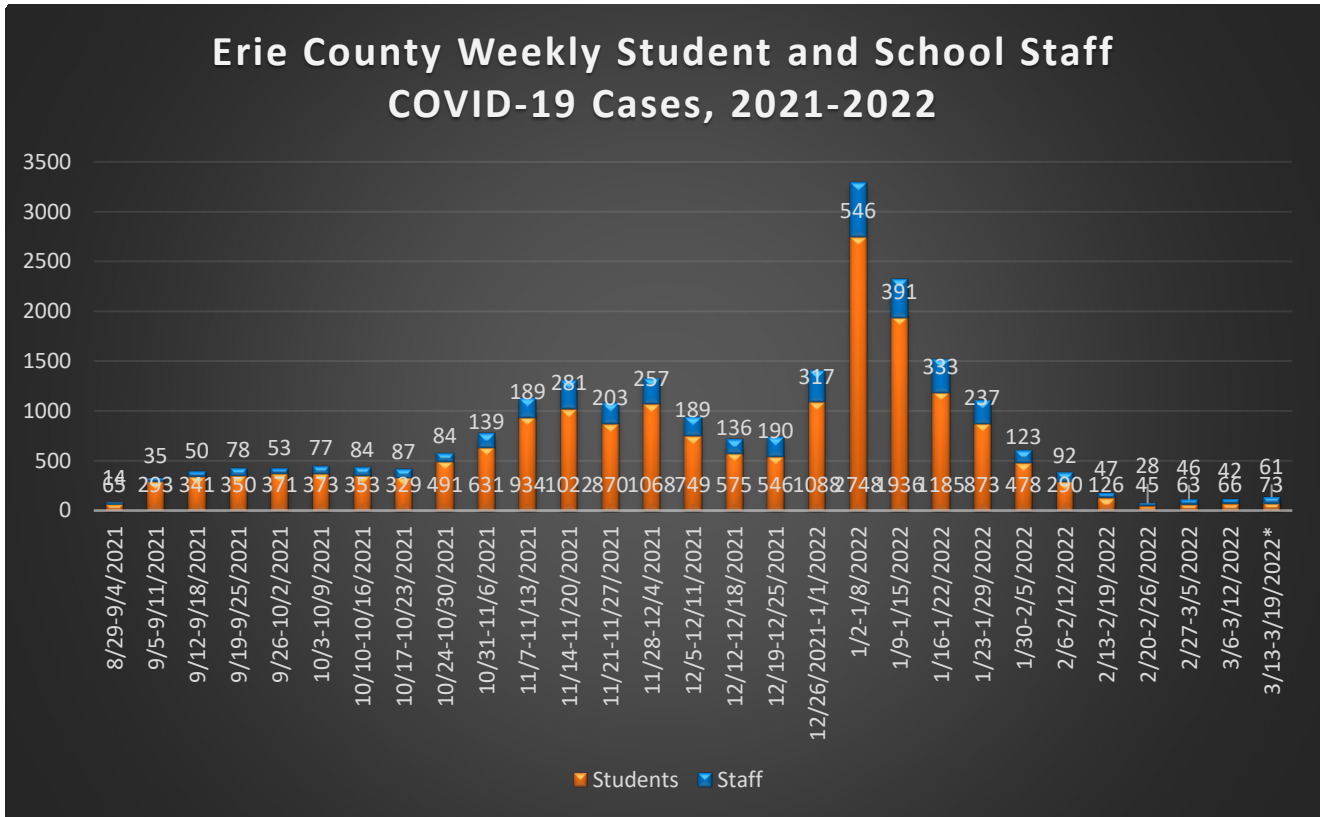

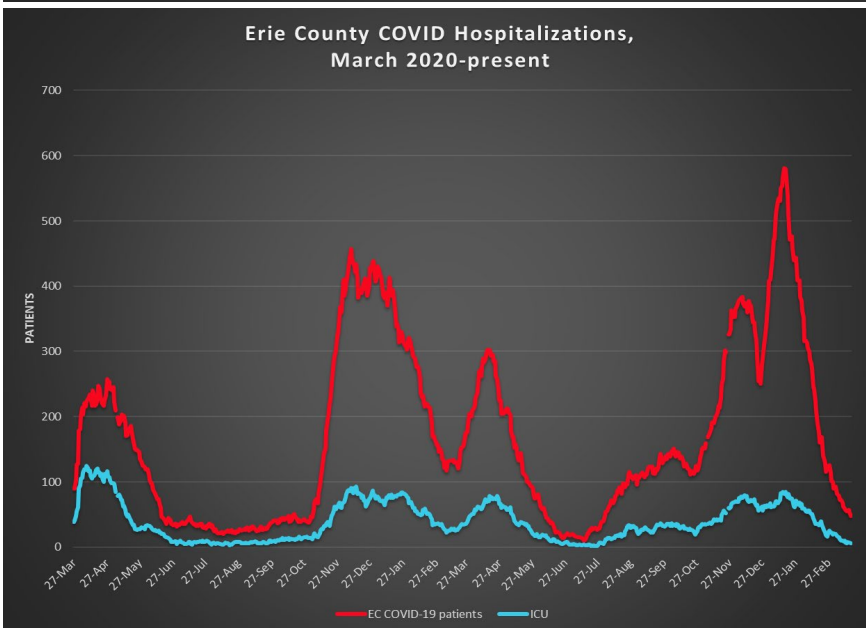
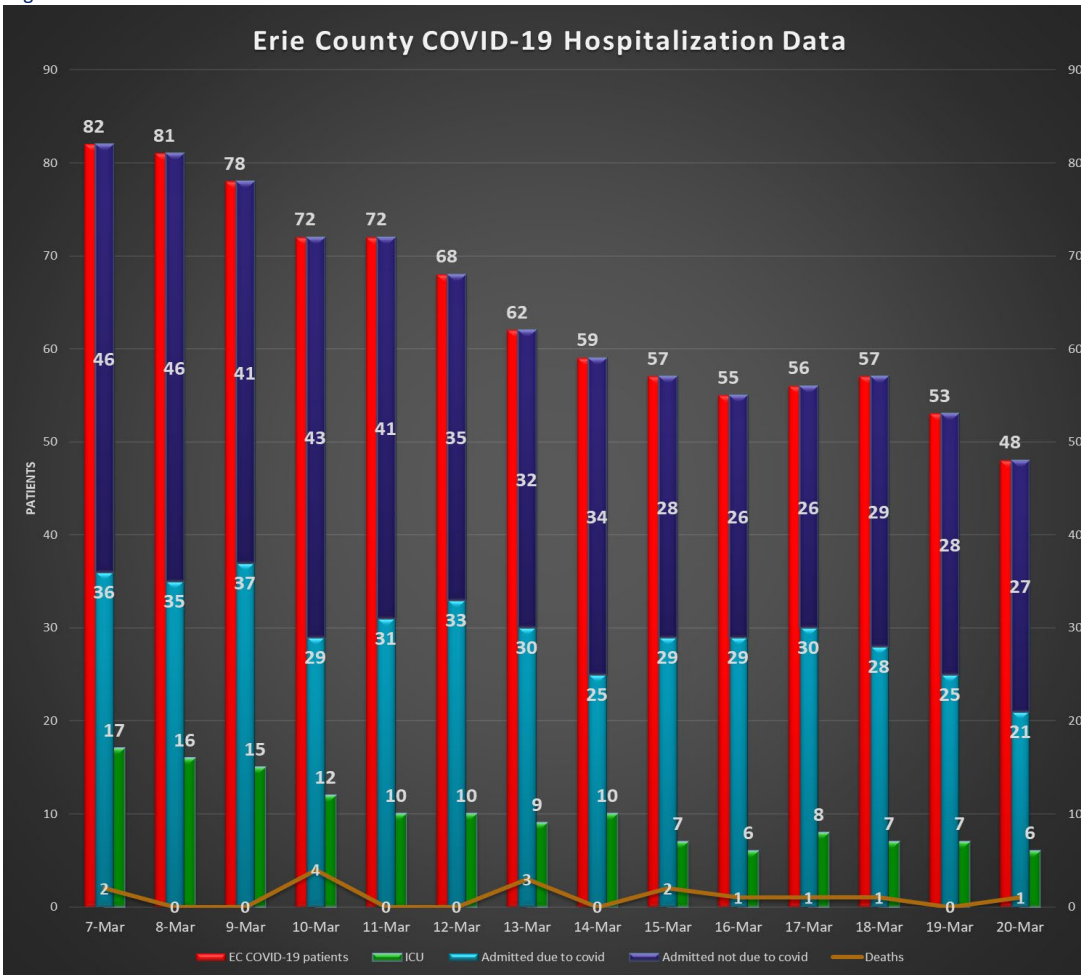
Figure 3: Erie County Weekly k-12 student and school staff COVID-19 cases
