# Trainings this quarter

- ▶ Continued naloxone trainings conducted, including:
  - ▶ Community members - 675
  - ▶ Expanding TOTs - 8 trainers trained!
  - ▶ EMS Staff, Medical Students - 21
  - ▶ Library Staff- > 4
  - ▶ High school teachers and administrators - 169
  - ▶ Volunteer firefighters - 225
  - ▶ Security staff: Colleges, malls - 19
  - ▶ Law enforcement - 48
  - ▶ Street outreach – Community Wellness staff – 9

# Training Statistics: Overall in all of Erie County since 2014

- First responders trained – 6250+ including fire, EMS and police
- Total Civilians trained – 15,000+ (average 1,750 per quarter)
- Total usage reports:
  - 1800+ and climbing from fire, police, EMS (many forms are missing); as of 8/30/2017:
  - 650+ and continuing to increase from community

- ▶ We're analyzing the data from the "naloxone usage forms"
  - ▶ Both the Police/Fire forms; a snap shot follows



# What's happening with naloxone/Narcan usage in WNY

- The following slides were created from the “opiate overdose reversal forms” that we collect from first responders specifically in the City of Buffalo
  - This has helped us understand the community affected
  - Each new batch of forms improves our data; so keep turning in those forms!

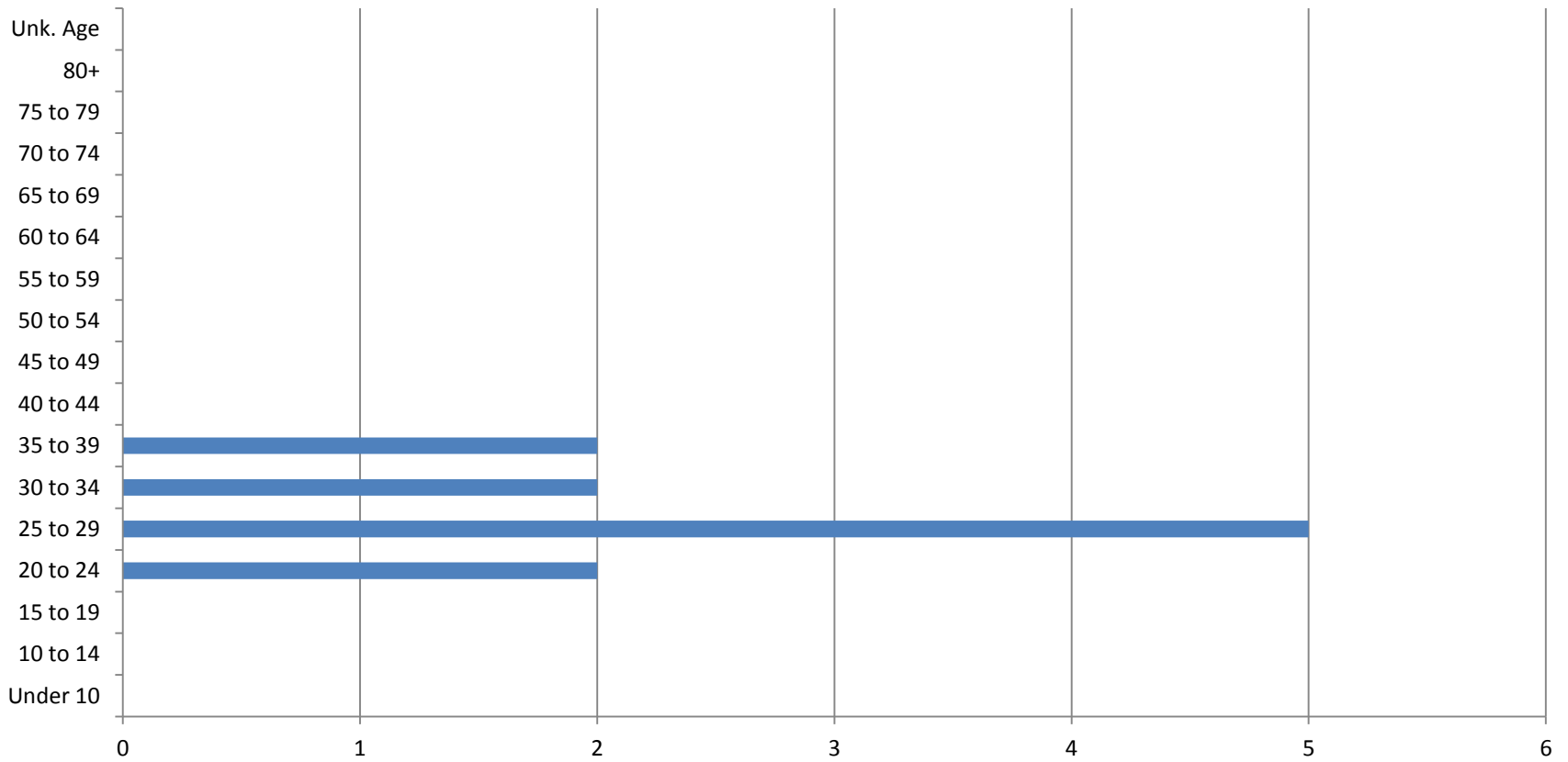
# Narcan Usage by First Responders by Year

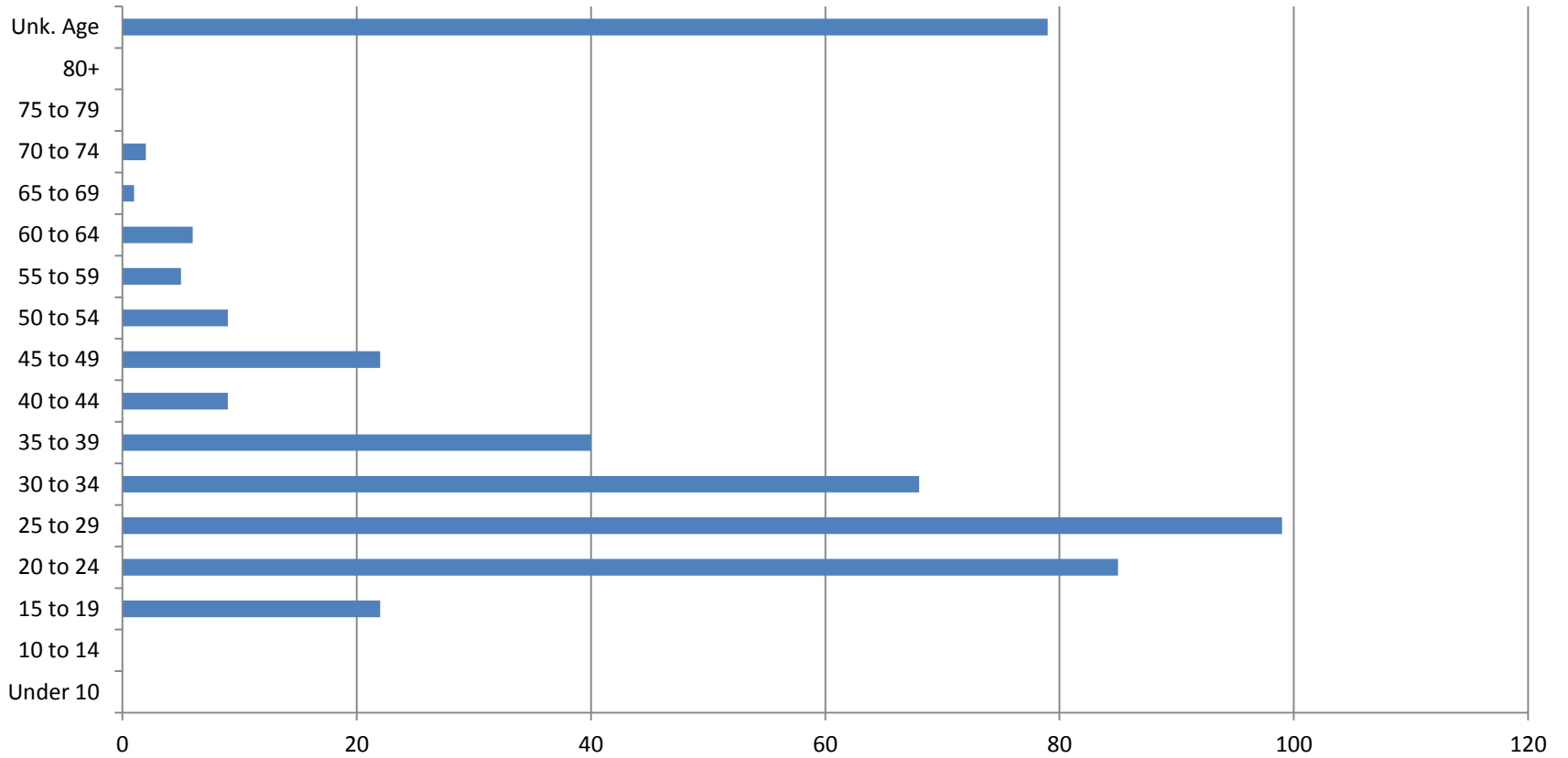

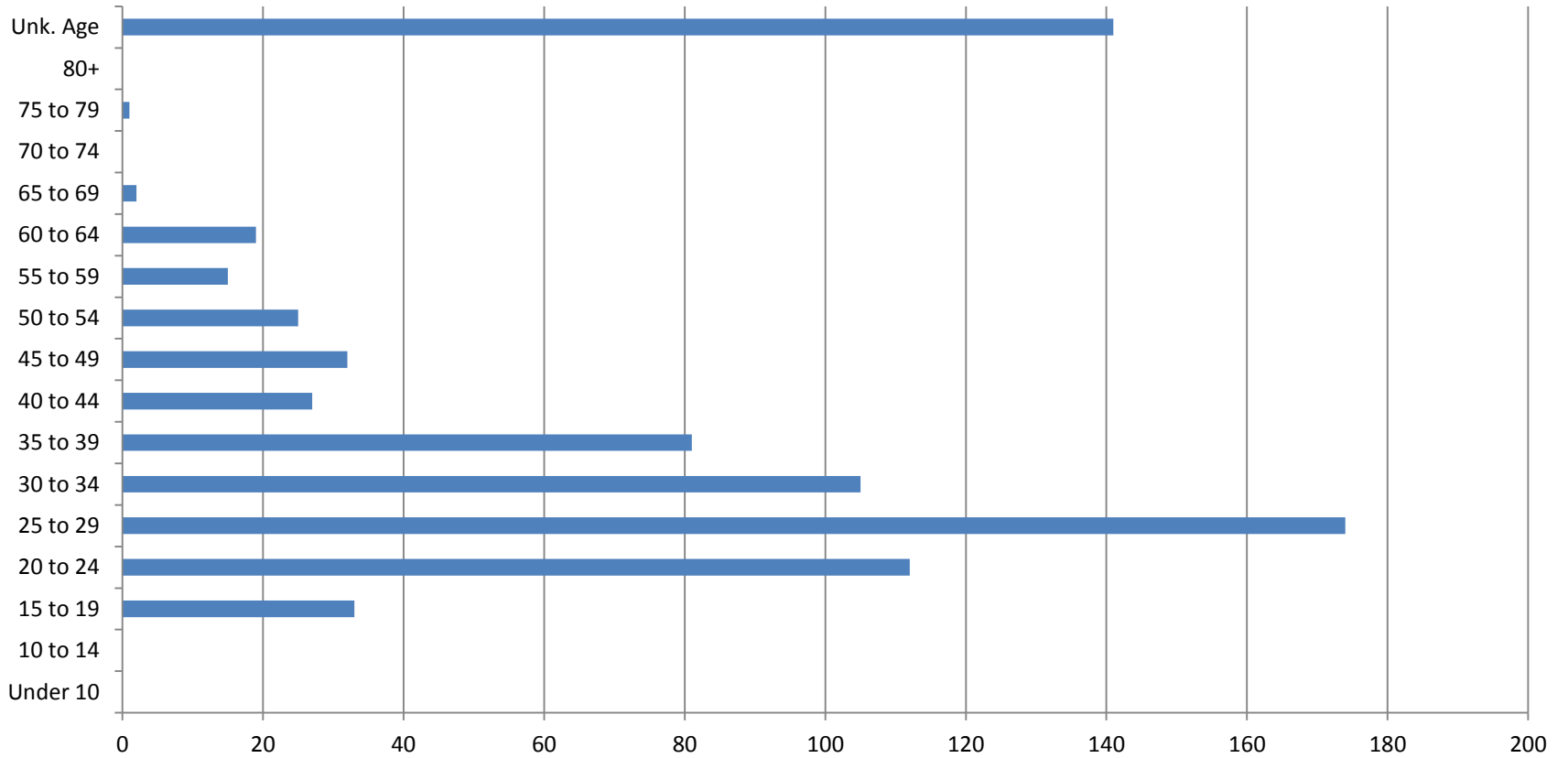

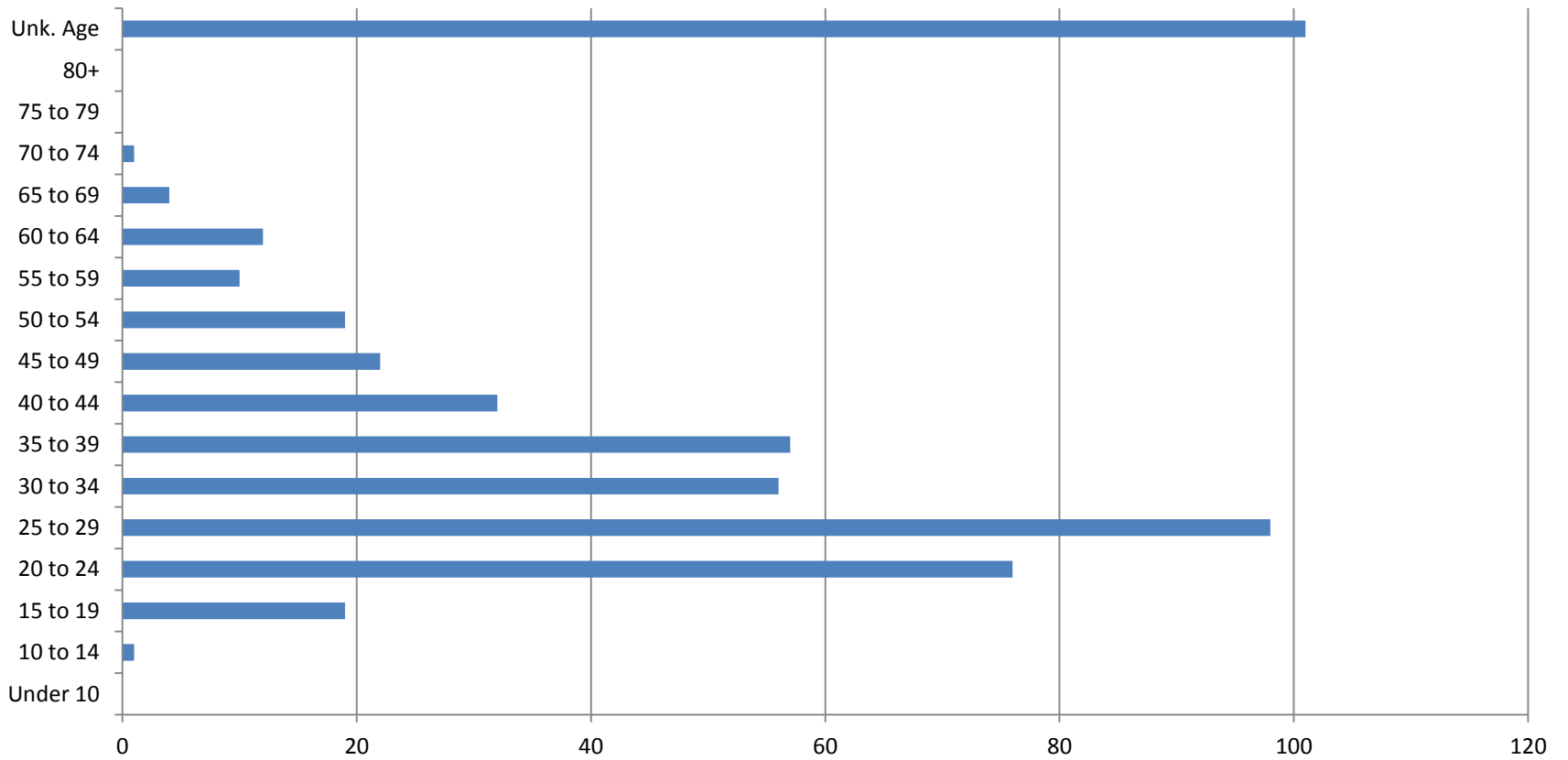

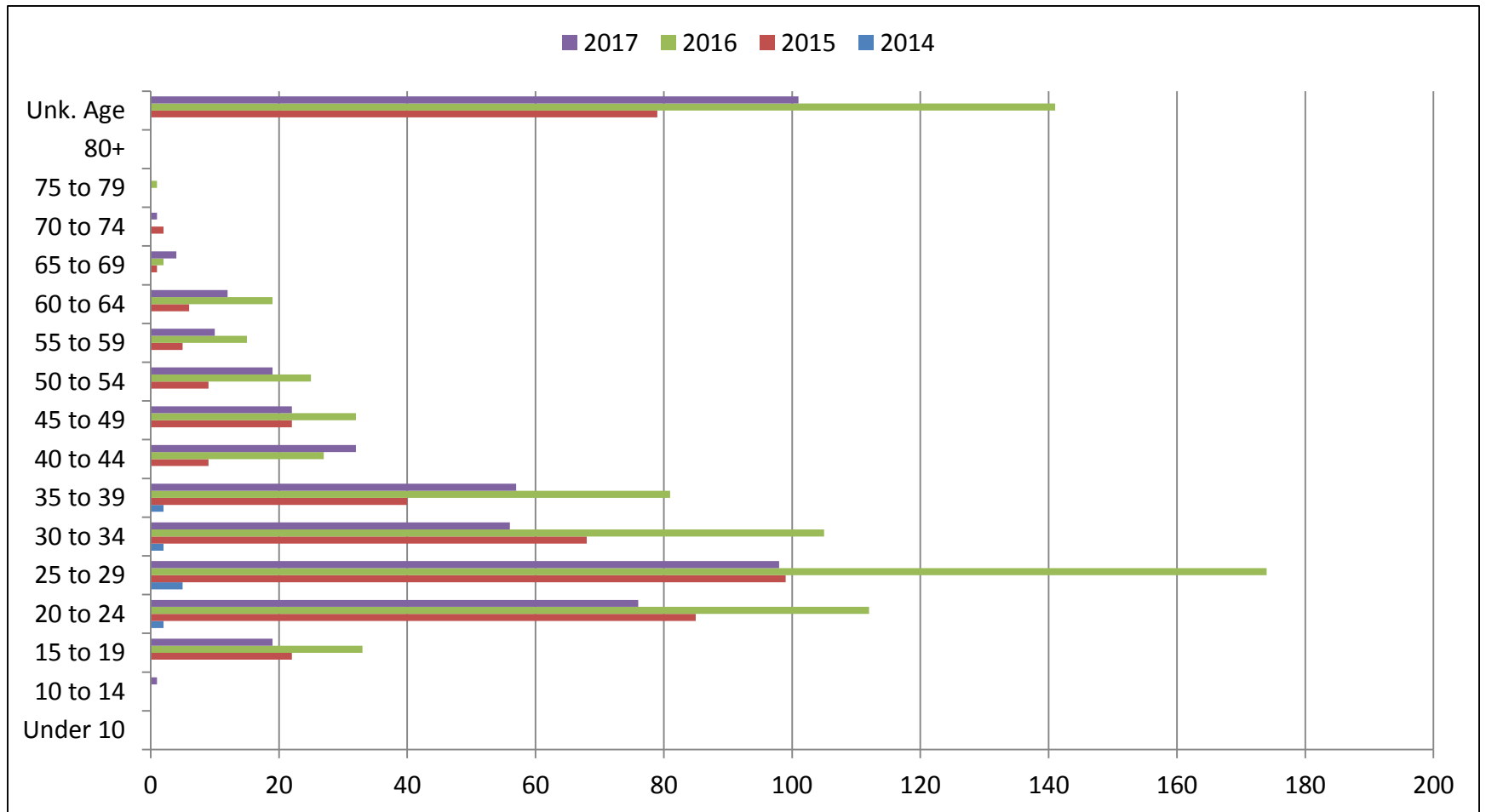

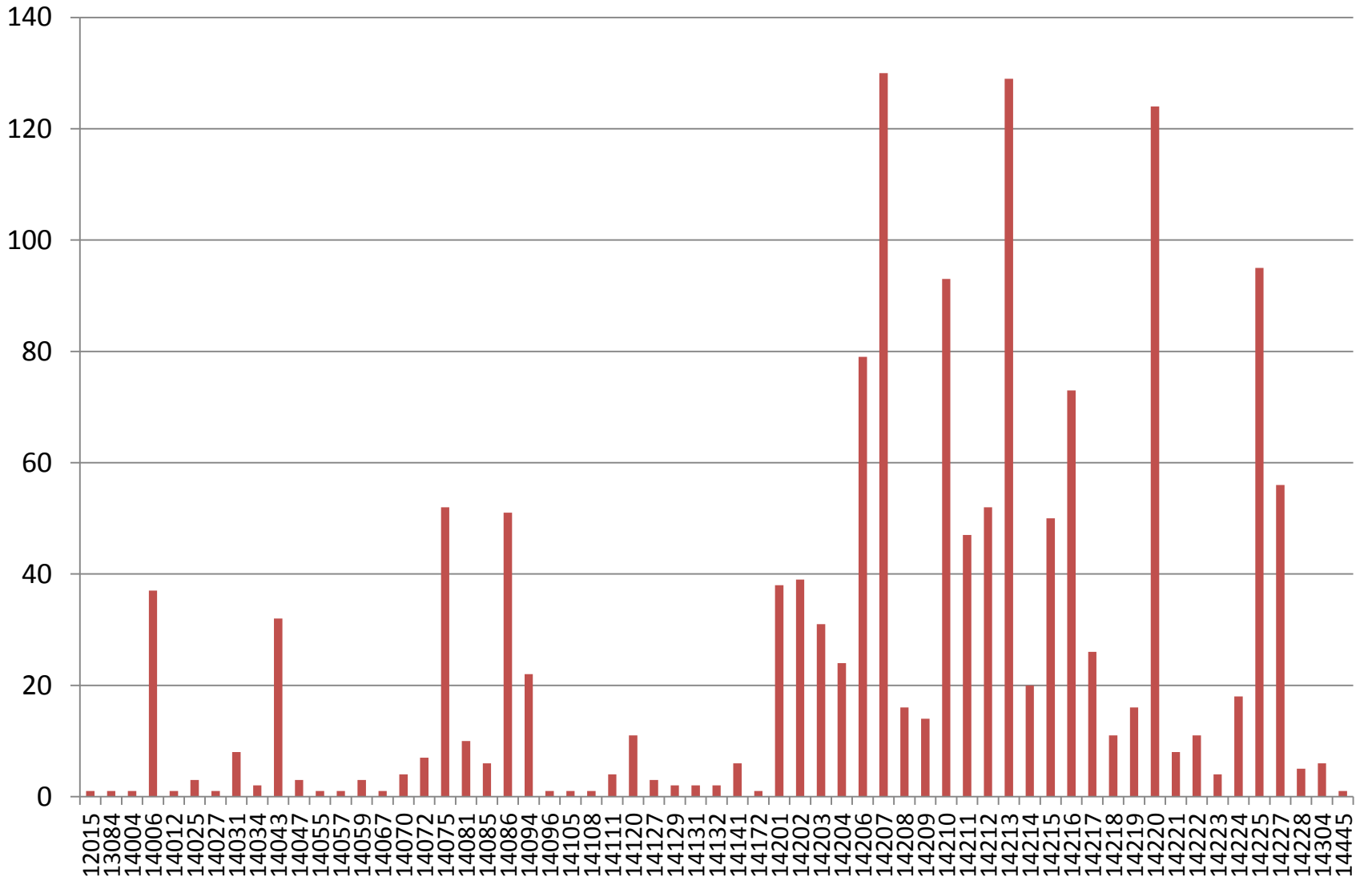

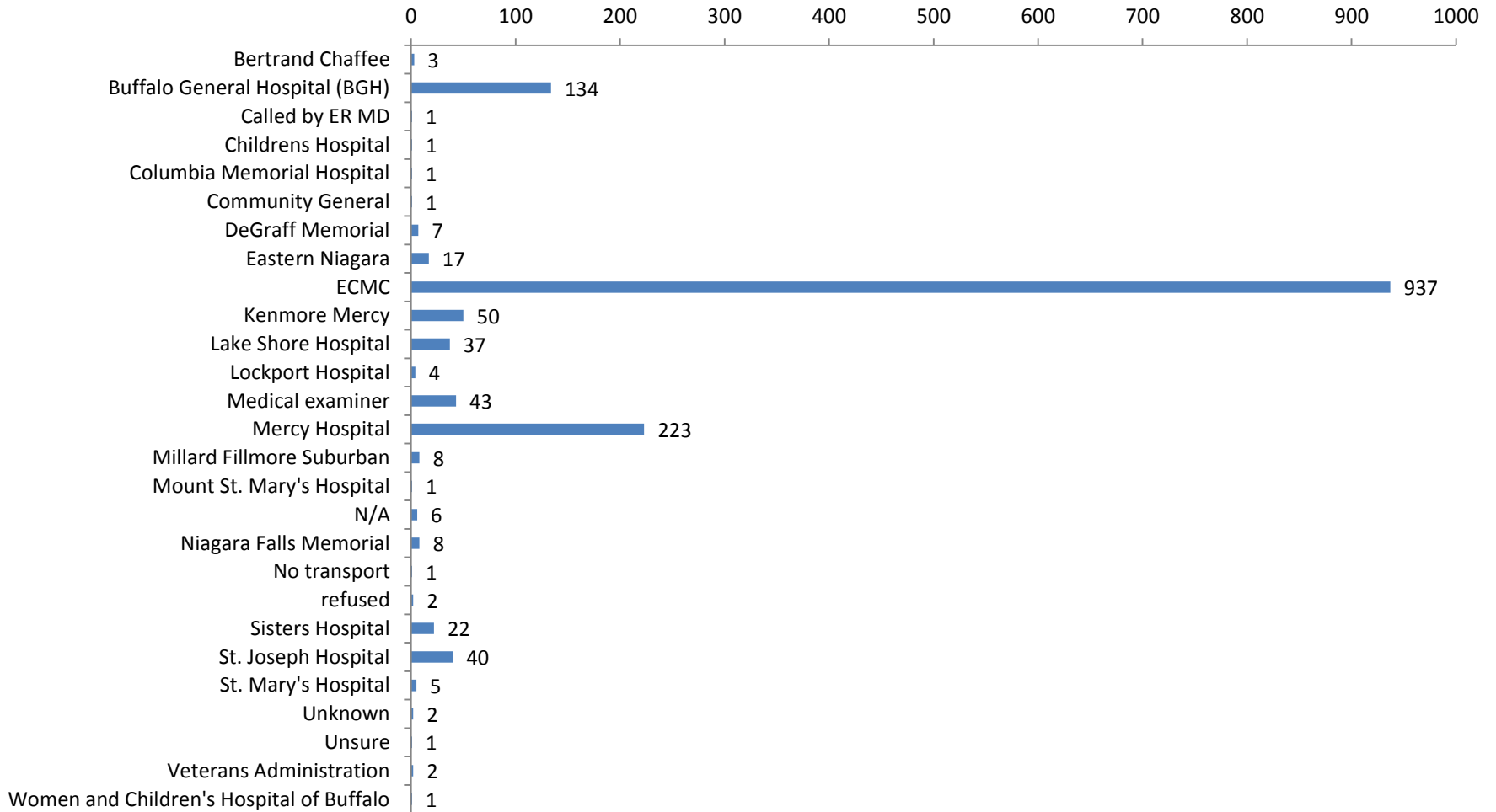


# 2014-2017, N=1,733



# ZIP Code, Excluding Unknowns





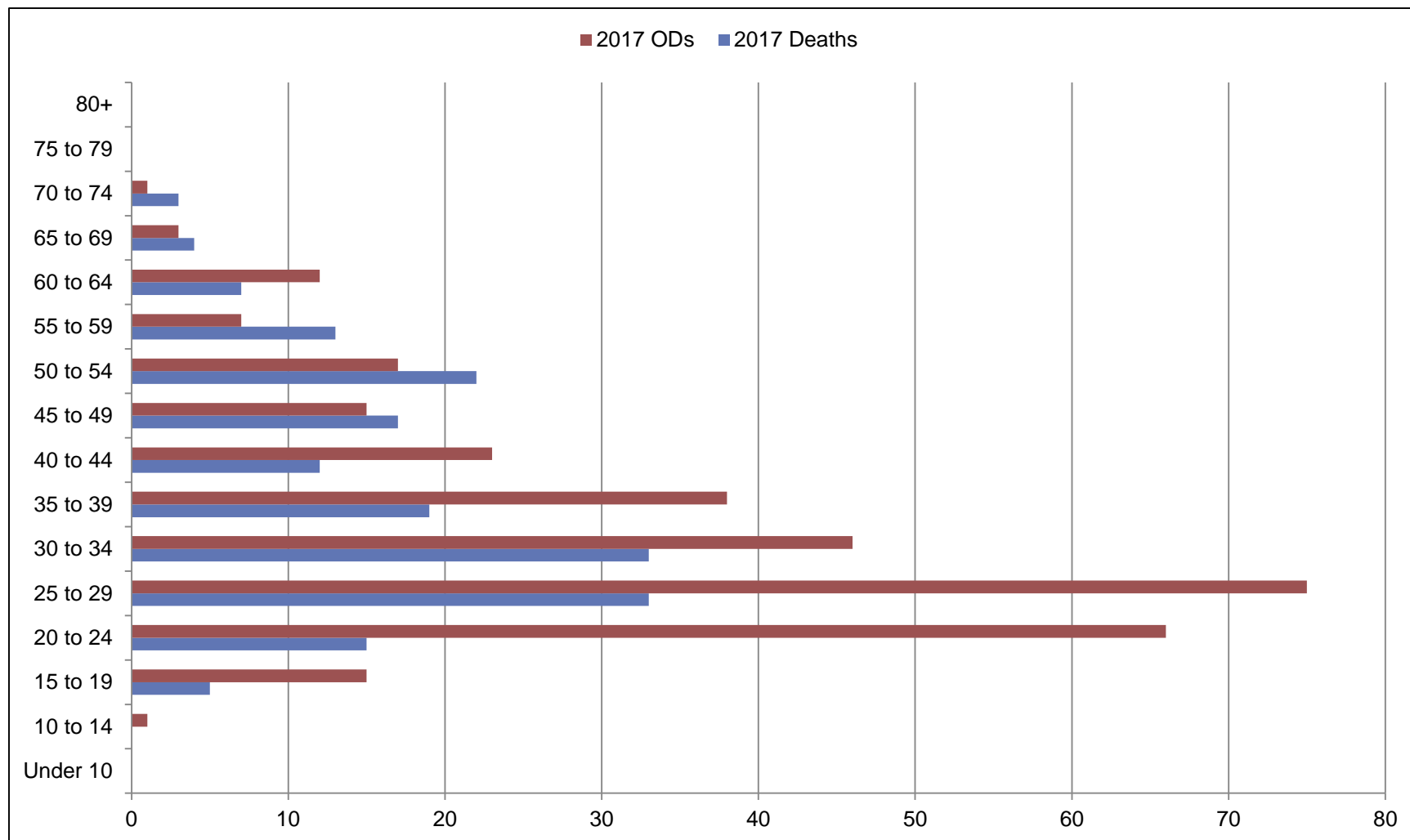
## Overdose Transport Sites


- 1,558 entries (excluding Unknowns)
- Dates from May 2014 through Nov 2017

# Notes

- Overdose data is from forms completed by police officers and firefighters after administering Narcan.
  - The database expands each time we enter more forms.
  - It is possible that multiple reports have been completed for the same individuals at different time points (repeat overdoses).
- Death data is from the Medical Examiner's office.

# Additional Naloxone Workgroup Activities

- ▶ Applying for grants to fund expanded efforts –
- ▶ 1. CARA funding received from BJA to coordinate and streamline naloxone reporting and linkage to treatment responses at time of overdoses, currently recruiting and training Peers and law enforcement departments – 4 additional police departments have signed on as partner sites. Creating additional response after overdose programs now
- ▶ 2. Collaborating with local treatment and prevention providers to implement OASAS Coalition grant, recently awarded.
- ▶ 4. Year 2 OOP funding from NYSDOHAI in process, billboard campaign in place
- ▶ New Project – “Community Narcan Access Sites”
