

LOCAL LAW No. 11 - 1973

A local law in relation to the salaries and longevity increases in the salaries of the county court judges, the family court judges, and the surrogate in Erie county. This local law shall supersede local law number ten—nineteen hundred seventy-one.

Became a law with the approval of the county executive. July 27, 1973. Passed by the local legislative body of the county of Erie. Filed in the office of the secretary of state July 31, 1973.

Be it enacted by the legislature of the county of Erie as follows:

Section 1. Salaries. The salaries of the county court judges, the family court judges, the surrogage* in Erie county shall be thirty-six thousand, four hundred dollars per year as of July first, nineteen hundred seventy-three, and shall be thirty-six thousand, eight hundred dollars per year as of January first, nineteen hundred seventy-four.

§ 2. Longevity increases. Effective July first, nineteen hundred seventy-three, and thereafter, any county court judge, any family court judge, and any surrogate in Erie county who completes nine (9) continuous years of service shall immediately be given an increase in salary of two and one-half percent of his base pay. Effective January first, nineteen hundred seventy-four, and thereafter, any such judge in Erie county who completes fourteen (14) continuous years of service shall immediately be given an increase in salary of two and one-half

percent of his base pay. Effective January first, nineteen hundred seventy-four, and thereafter, any such judge in Erie county who completes nineteen (19) continuous years of service shall immediately be given an increase in salary of two and one-half percent of his base pay.

§ 3. Scope. This local law shall supersede local law number ten—nineteen hundred seventy-one.

§ 4. Effective date. This local law shall be effective July first, nineteen hundred seventy-three.
