A LOCAL LAW amending Local Law No. 1 - 1960, constituting the Erie County Administrative Code, by amending § 3.10 thereof to provide that computer operations of the Department of Central Police Services shall be under the exclusive jurisdiction of the Commissioner of the Department of Central Police Services.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Basis for local law. The instant local law is a companion local law to Local Law Intro. No. 27 - 1974, and amends the Administrative Code in the same manner and for the same reasons as Local Law Intro. No. 27 - 1974 amends the Charter, and as detailed under Section 1 of Local Law Intro. No. 27 - 1974.

Section 2. Section 3.10 of Local Law No. 1 - 1960, constituting the Erie County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 3.10 Division of data processing. The division of data processing shall be headed by the director of data processing who shall have all the powers and duties lawfully conferred or imposed upon him by the county charter, by local law, by order or direction of the county executive, or by any applicable provision of any act of the legislature

not in conflict with the county charter or this code.

Such powers and duties shall include the care and supervision of all computers and related electronic equipment in the data processing division, the preparation of programs and data for input into such computers, the processing and storage of output from such equipment, the supply of such output information to participating county departments and agencies, and the coordination of all county-owned or county-operated computer installations. The data processing division shall advise and assist all departments of the county in matters relating to the installation of new data processing applications and modifications of existing procedures; evaluate and coordinate data processing requirements for participating departments and agencies; assist in the conversion of raw data into machine-usable materials or perform such function itself; carry out all functions related to the operation of data processing equipment, and train personnel of participating departments and agencies in acquisition of data in a form suitable for processing. However, the acquisition, replacement, operation, and informational input and output of any computers and related electronic equipment used by the Department of Central Police Services in connection with any criminal justice program shall be under the exclusive control of the Commissioner of Central Police Services, subject to contracting and purchasing regulations and procedures set forth in the Charter and Administrative Code. The county executive may enter into a contract with the federal government, state government and any municipal corporation to

provide data processing service to any such municipality or governmental entity, subject to the approval of the legislature.

Section 3. Effective date. This local law shall be effective immediately.
