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WHEREAS, The County Legislature of the County of Erie, New York, has heretofore duly directed that there be prepared a report and estimate of cost by the County Engineers (Erie County Department of Environment and Planning) relating to a proposed modification of plans for the increase and improvement of the facilities for County Sewer District No. 3 authorized by the County Legislature, which report and estimate of cost have been filed with the County Legislature pursuant to Section 253-b of the County Law; and

WHEREAS, such report and estimate of cost have been approved by the Erie County Sewer Agency pursuant to a written report, which has also been filed with said County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, said report and estimate of cost describe a proposed modification of plans for such increase and improvement of the facilities of Erie County Sewer District No. 3 in said County, consisting

of the replacement of the Southtowns Sewerage Treatment Plant's roof and the rehabilitation of treatment plant infrastructure, all as more fully described in the report and estimate of cost herein referred to; and

WHEREAS, the maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid design, engineering, and construction of the facilities of said Sewer District is \$570,000, to be apportioned by the assessment and levy on the real property in (i) Erie County Sewer District No. 3, (ii) the Town of Hamburg on behalf of the Hamburg Master Sewer District, Amsdell Heights, Locksley Park, Cloverbank, Benz and Taylor Road Sewer Districts being Sewer District Nos. 21, 7, 10, 5, 4, 8, and 11 of the Town of Hamburg, (iii) Wanakah Sewer District No. 3, (iv) Mount Vernon Sewer District No. 2, (v) the Village of Hamburg and (vi) the Village of Blasdell; each in accordance with their respective proportionate shares of equivalent dwelling units in their service areas, as determined pursuant to the Southtowns Agreement; and

WHEREAS, said County Legislature duly adopted Resolution No. 17 on the <u>29th</u> day of <u>January</u>, 2009, calling a meeting of the County Legislature for the purpose of holding a public hearing to consider said modification of plans for such increase and improvement of facilities in accordance with the provisions of Section 253-b of the County Law; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held at 92 Franklin Street, 4th Floor, Buffalo, New York, in said County, on the <u>24th</u> day of <u>February</u>, 2009, at <u>1:30 P.M.</u> o'clock P.M., Prevailing Time; and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly published in substantially the manner provided by law and proof thereof was submitted to said County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, said County Legislature had duly considered the evidence given at such public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Upon the evidence given at the aforesaid public hearing, it is hereby found and determined that it is in the public interest to modify the plans for such increase and improvement of the facilities of Erie County Sewer District No. 3 in the County of Erie, New York, all as more fully described in the preambles hereof, and such modification of plans for the increase and improvement of facilities is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$570,000.

Section 2. The cost of the proposed modification expenditure is to be apportioned by the assessment and levy on the real property in (i) Erie County Sewer District No. 3, (ii) the Town of Hamburg on behalf of the Hamburg Master Sewer District, Amsdell Heights, Locksley Park, Cloverbank, Benz and Taylor Road Sewer Districts being Sewer District Nos. 21, 7, 10, 5, 4, 8, and 11 of the Town of Hamburg, (iii) Wanakah Sewer District No. 3, (iv) Mount Vernon Sewer District No. 2, (v) the Village of Hamburg and (vi) the Village of Blasdell; each in accordance with their respective proportionate shares of equivalent dwelling units in their service areas, as determined pursuant to the Southtowns Agreement.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately. (6-0)

COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, the Buffalo and Erie County Greenway Fund – Standing Committee awarded Erie County \$205,000 to prepare a Shoreline Trail Signage – Riverwalk Section project; and

WHEREAS, said project will develop a signage site and amenity specification manual for all existing and future trail segments within the Niagara River Greenway area; and

WHEREAS, the Eric County Standing Committee will utilize the Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo as their contracting agent for fund disbursements; and

WHEREAS, the Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy has requested that a park furnishings element be added to the project to ensure economies of scale within the project budget; and

WHEREAS, Wendel-Duchscherer has undertaken initial elements of the project through completion of a Shoreline Trail Signage and Wayfaring Study in 2004 on behalf of Erie County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a funding agreement with the Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo in an amount not to exceed \$205,000 for the purpose of carrying out the Shoreline Trail – Riverwalk Section Signage project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a funding agreement with the Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy in an amount not to exceed \$7,800 for the purpose of undertaking the park furnishings element of the aforementioned project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a professional services contract with Wendel-Duchscherer for an amount not to exceed \$54,000 for the purposes of design and construction inspection services associated with the Shoreline Trail – Riverwalk Section – Signage and Park Furnishing System; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the requirement for requests for proposals in Section 19.08 of the Erie County Administrative Code are hereby waived since the agreement is a continuation of work actions undertaken as part of the 2004 Shoreline Trail Signage Wayfaring Study; and be it further

RESOLVED, that authorization is hereby provided to establish a capital account to be known as the Shoreline Trail – Riverwalk Section Signage and Park Furnishing System for the period March 1, 2009 to December 31, 2011 as follows:

4. COMM. 2E-9 (2009)

COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning (ECDEP) provides technical assistance to municipalities to assist them to comply with environmental regulations; and

WHEREAS, the ECDEP has previously been contracted by the County's two solid waste management boards to assist with compliance with their solid waste management plans; and

WHEREAS, Erie County's two solid waste management boards have signed separate Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) for the ECDEP to provide the necessary services for compliance with each Solid Waste Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, each MOU represents a two-year commitment of \$10,125 from each Board per year for a total of \$40,500; and

WHEREAS, a United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) grant-funded program for the Erie County Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Project to begin on January 1, 2009, has been established through Comm. 5E-20; and

WHEREAS, the USEPA program can be effectively combined with the services required by the MOU's submitted by the two solid waste management boards; and

WHEREAS, the current position of JG-7, RPT, managing the USEPA grant program will assume the additional responsibilities associated with the two MOU's; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to revise the USEPA Budget 162INTEGPESTMG0810 (Fund 281) to incorporate the additional funding; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to change the existing JG-7, RPT, to a full time position retroactive to January 1, 2009, to effectively meet the objectives of the County's solid waste boards.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is authorized to enter into separate agreements with the Northeast Southtowns Solid Waste Management Board (NEST) and the Northwest Solid Waste Management Board (NWSWMB) to accept the combined funds not to exceed \$40,500; and be it further

RESOLVED, that these funds will be added to the Erie County IPM Project Budget 162INTEGPESTMG0810 (Fund 281) in Personnel/Salaries and Fringe Benefits; and be it further

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks, Recreation & Forestry desires to enter into an agreement with the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation for Snowmobile Trail Development during the 2008-2009 snowmobile season for funding in an amount not to exceed \$219.575.00; and

WHEREAS, the sum of \$1,000.00 is budgeted as a state revenue for snowmobile development in the 2009 Adopted Budget of the Division of Parks; and

WHEREAS, this agreement with the State shall pertain to such maintenance as performed by the Erie County Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry within the County parks and forest lots, as well as similar work performed by the individual Snowmobile Clubs of Erie County on club trails located outside County-owned lands.
