SUMMARY

The attached resolution requests authorization to accept Justice Assistance Grant funding from the City of Buffalo in the amount of \$10,810.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be no impact on County funds. The grant is 100% funded by the City of Buffalo.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The electronic submission of Criminal history information will improve the speed and accuracy of data available to law enforcement, prosecuting attorneys and the court systems.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Law enforcement agencies in the County of Erie recently began utilizing a computer-based system called the Criminal History Arrest Records Management System (CHARMS). This system is used for dispatching functions, records management, personnel, property management and arrest booking.

With JAG 2012 funding, Central Police Services plans to initiate a third party contract to develop system enhancements to the CHARMS system.

After approval of this item, Central Police Services will engage the services of Globalquest Solutions, Inc., a local WBE/New York State contract vendor, to develop the CHARMS system enhancements.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Failure to approve this request would restrict CPS in its efforts to provide enhancement to the law enforcement CHARMS system.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

Central Police Services will work with the Division of Budget and Management to implement this request.
