SUMMARY

Approval of an agreement with the Western New York Council on Occupational Safety & Health (WNYCOSH) for safety training classes to be provided to Sewer District employees through a New York State Department of Labor (NYSDOL), Hazard Abatement Board grant is requested.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be no fiscal impact on Erie County's General Fund or Sewer Fund. All costs for the training will be paid by WNYCOSH.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

There is an opportunity to provide mandated safety and health training to Sewer District staff without charge to the Sewer Districts. Without this free training, the Sewer Districts would have to provide the mandated safety and health training using their own funds.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

State and federal regulations mandate specific training for sewer operation and maintenance personnel. Failure to provide this training could result in NYSDOL fines. A lack of adequate training would put County employees at risk.

CONSEQUENCES OF A NEGATIVE ACTION

Any of the required training not provided through the grant will be conducted at the Sewer District's expense.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

No further legislation action will be required. The agreement will be executed with WNYCOSH and the training initiated.
