RE: Medical Examiner Acceptance of NYS Grant Award

Dear Honorable Members:

The Medical Examiner's Division of the Erie County Department of Health is tasked with performing analytical testing of blood and urine for the presence of prescription and non-prescription drugs and to determine their concentration. These samples are submitted to the Medical Examiner's laboratory by law enforcement agencies when a person is apprehended for driving while impaired by alcohol and/or drugs.

Analytical testing of blood and urine for the presence of prescription and non-prescription drugs requires the laboratory to use certified reference materials purchased from reliable sources to perform this work. These materials are quite expensive and due to the proliferation of new and old drugs used by the driving public, the cost to the laboratory is very high. The enclosed resolution authorizes acceptance of a grant award from New York State in the amount of \$15,000 to be used to purchase the certified reference materials.

SUMMARY

Authorization is requested to accept a \$15,000 grant award from the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles Highway Safety Program.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The County will receive funding in the amount of \$15,000 awarded by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles Highway Safety Program.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

Analytical testing of blood and urine for the presence of prescription and non-prescription drugs requires the laboratory to use certified reference materials purchased from reliable sources to perform this work. These materials are quite expensive and due to the proliferation of new and old drugs used by the driving public, the cost to the laboratory is very high. Acceptance of this funding will allow for the purchase of certified reference materials without cost to the County.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Medical Examiner's Division Forensic Toxicology Laboratory is tasked to perform analytical testing of blood and urine for the presence of prescription and non-prescription drugs and to determine their concentration. These samples are submitted to the laboratory by law enforcement agencies when a person is apprehended for driving while impaired by alcohol and/or drugs.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The County Executive will be unable to accept the grant award and thereby unable to assist the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles Highway Safety Program with their efforts to reduce the number of crashes, injuries and deaths on the roadways.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Health Department will follow appropriate steps necessary to implement the provisions of the grant award.

WHEREAS, funding will be used for the purchase of certified reference material.
