Re: Restoration of full-time Chaplain position at Erie County Holding Center

Dear County Executive Poloncarz:

The members of the Erie County Community Corrections Advisory Board believe that the prisoners at the Erie County Holding Center should have access to a full-time Chaplain. They agree with Common Council Member Reverend Darius G. Pridgen that, the presence of a Chaplain can reduce the incidence of recidivism. Enclosed is a copy of a letter from Rev. Pridgen, in which he explains why the presence of a full-time Chaplain is beneficial to the prisoners and the community.

The present policy of using volunteers, and providing a small stipend to one of the volunteers to conduct 1 weekly church service is not sufficient.

Until 2005 prisoners at the Holding Center had the benefit of a full-time Chaplain. Sadly the position was eliminated in 2005. I am writing on behalf of the Board to request that you support restoration of the Chaplain position in the next Erie County Budget.
