PROPOSED MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING OF THE BUFFALO AND ERIE COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES October 18, 2012

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library was held on Thursday, October 18, 2012, in the Central Library pursuant to due notice to trustees. The following members were present:

Chair Jack Connors called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m. in the Joseph B. Rounds Conference Room. Trustee Kelly was in attendance via conference call. A quorum was present.

Agenda Item B - Approval/Changes to the Agenda. Mr. Connors informed trustees the agenda required an amendment to add Executive Session after New Business to discuss correspondence from Library counsel regarding the proposed district legislation which is attorney/client privileged information at this point. Mr. Wisbaum moved and was seconded by Ms. Panty. Approval was unanimous.

Agenda Item C - Minutes of the Meeting of September 20, 2012. On motion by Ms. Panty, seconded by Ms. Thomas, the September Minutes were approved as mailed.

Agenda Item D – Report of the Chair. Mr. Connors reported County Executive Mark Poloncarz's 2013 Budget recommended \$300,000 in restored funds for the Library for which we are appreciative, but it is a far cry from the \$3.6 million we had asked for. As the Library requested, he did move the \$2 million Interfund Revenue Subsidy into the tax levy. Once in the tax levy, this cannot be touched. Deputy Director Kenneth Stone will discuss this later in the agenda. Distributed to trustees was a copy of a letter sent to

each Erie County Legislator informing them while the Library is grateful for the \$300,000, the Library is still in need of the additional \$3.3 million asked for.

Mr. Connors conveyed to trustees it is our understanding the Mayor's office has transmitted to the County Executive's office recommendations for the B&ECPL Trustee appointment of Sheldon Berlow, as well as reappointments of Sharon Thomas and Frank Gist. Ms. Jakubowski reported she is having conversations with Kimberly Trent of the Mayor's office to confirm this and it will be looked into further. The Library recently found out the Erie County Executive's Library liaison is no longer with his office; we are waiting to hear who the Library's new liaison will be.

Agenda Item E - Committee Reports.

Agenda Item E.1 - Executive Committee. Mr. Connors reported the Executive Committee met on October 11, 2012 and read the following report:

Present: Executive Committee members Jack Connors, Anne Leary and Elaine Panty along with Trustee Phyllis Horton, Director Mary Jean Jakubowski and CFO Kenneth Stone.

Chair Jack Connors called the meeting to order at 4:10 p.m. in the Joseph B. Rounds Conference Room of the Central Library. A quorum was present.

The group reviewed the agenda for the upcoming October 18, 2012 Board of Trustees meeting including the two resolutions that will be presented to the Board.

Mr. Stone discussed:

• Resolution 2012-40 - IMLS Grant Award and Budgeting

Mrs. Jakubowski discussed:

 Resolution 2012-41 - Amend Policy for Cooperation with Organizations and Agencies

Mrs. Jakubowski spoke to the Committee regarding the Erie County Association of Governments inability to include a presentation from the System regarding the district initiative in any of their upcoming meetings. She suggested the Library Board invite members of the group and other local officials to attend a library sponsored program where questions can be answered. Executive Committee agreed this would be a good idea. Mr. Connors suggested meetings be held in November/December.

Mrs. Jakubowski reported on the current status of the *Turn the Lights Back On* campaign – reminding everyone that the County Executive's 2013 Budget must be out on October 15th. She suggested a 2013 budget update be place on the Agenda. The October 18th Proposed Agenda was updated to include a 2013 Budget Update under New Business.

The Executive Committee meeting concluded at 4:50 p.m.

Agenda Item E.2 - Budget and Finance Committee.

Agenda Item E.2.a - IMLS Grant Award and Budgeting. Deputy Director Stone noted this is a two-year grant totaling \$319,809 as described in the resolution. Ms. Thomas moved for approval and was seconded by Ms. Panty. Approval was unanimous.

RESOLUTION 2012-40

WHEREAS, on September 20, 2012 the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library (B&ECPL) was notified it has been selected as a recipient of a 2012 National Leadership Grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), and

WHEREAS, the amount of the award is \$319,809, and

WHEREAS, the Library shall administer the funds for the Library and its partners: Buffalo Broadcasters Association, the University at Buffalo Center for Urban Studies, Cleveland State University's Center for Public History & Digital Humanities, and Randforce Associates, LLC, and

WHEREAS, the grant funds shall be used over the course of two-years to demonstrate the concept of a "digitized commons" that emphasizes selection and digitization of collections that are tied directly to virtual and physical activities and events that encourage local civic engagement, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, the B&ECPL Board of Trustees authorizes amending the 2012 Grants Budget by appropriating grant revenues and expenditures in the amount of \$319,809 to support: "The Public Library as Digitized Commons: A Demonstration Project."

Agenda Item E.2.b – Monthly Financial Report. The monthly financial report for the period ending August 31, 2012 was included in the Board packet for information. Mr. Stone reported the Library is operating within budget. Mr. Connors inquired if there were any significant savings; Mr. Stone responded utilities are a big savings and discussed this further.

Agenda Item E.3 - Policy Committee. Chair Elaine Panty reported the Policy Committee met October 11, 2012 at the Central Library. Present were Policy Committee members Panty, Connors and Horton, along with Director Mary Jean Jakubowski. Ms. Jakubowski reviewed changes to amend the Policy for Cooperation with Organizations and Agencies; these changes were all reviewed and approved by Library counsel Patrick Martin. The Policy Committee unanimously recommended the amended policy by brought to the October 18th meeting of the B&ECPL Board of Trustees for approval by the full Board.

Ms. Jakubowski recommended the Policy Committee delay review of the Facility Use Policy and Mason O. Damon Auditorium Policy as the Administrative Team is working to combine the two policies and include the Buffalo Branches in the consolidated policy. The Circulation and Collection Development Policies are expected to be reviewed in December. The meeting ended at 3:45 p.m.

Agenda Item E.3.a – Amend Policy for Cooperation with Organizations and Agencies. Mr. Connors noted this policy was adopted in 2002, changes were for clarification purposes and trustees were able to view recommended changes and new language as well as deleted text. Ms. Thomas moved for approval, Mr. Johnson seconded, and approval of Resolution 2012-41 was unanimous.

RESOLUTION 2012-41

WHEREAS, as part of the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library's (B&ECPL) adopted Organizational Competencies, the Library has put together a new structure for process and review of the Library's standing policies to ensure that they remain timely and effective, and

WHEREAS, the Policy Committee used this process to review and make recommendations to amend the attached draft of the Policy for Cooperation with Organizations and Agencies, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library adopts the proposed revisions of the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library's Policy for Cooperation with Organizations and Agencies to supersede and replace the prevailing policy, adopted April 18, 2002, and be it further

RESOLVED, that B&ECPL administration is hereby authorized to develop such instruments as may be required to implement this policy.

Agenda Item E.4 - Development Committee. Chair Anne Leary reported the Development Committee met prior to the Board meeting at 3 p.m. and reviewed the upcoming event - What's Black and White and Read All Over? Total number of tickets sold are 85 and there are approximately 15 sponsors to date. Invitations were distributed to each trustee. She encouraged Board members to attend. Business First

has provided ad space for this event, updating ads promoting this event on a weekly basis adding sponsors as they come on board, and will be running a large thank you ad after the event. Further discussion ensued. They also reviewed the *Milestones of Science Exhibit Update 10/17/2012* (which was also distributed to each trustee) and discussed what the Committee can do as far as development around this exhibit.

Agenda Item F - Report of the Director. Ms. Jakubowski provided an update on the *Turn the Lights Back On* campaign which was working towards having the County Executive provide the Library with additional funding. Over 7,500 postcards were walked over to the County Executive's office in addition to postcards that were mailed directly to him. She stressed that in the County Executive's 2013 Budget, while the Library is receiving an additional \$300,000, it is not the \$3.6 million asked for and the Library needs to move to the next step. The legislators need to be encouraged to give the Library the additional \$3.3 million it requested. Postings on the Library's webpage as well as social media sites about the next step will be out soon.

In the month of October, together with many partners throughout Erie County, the Library engaged in an anti-bullying campaign - Bullying Stops Here. Trustees were asked to sign an anti-bullying poster to go along with the other 8 posters already completely signed at the Central Library.

Ms. Jakubowski passed around a *Ken-Ton Bee* article which contained an exclusive online poll from October 3rd asking the question of the week – "Does the Library System deserve to have an additional \$3.6 million provided by the County?" The results came in and were published in the October 10th edition revealing 56% of the people responding to this poll said yes, and 44% said no. A scanned copy was sent to Legislators Hardwick and Marinelli.

She thanked the Library Foundation for receipt of a total of \$3,929, via the Community Foundation, from designated funds going towards such things as children's programming and materials, staff training and preservation of rare book material.

A brochure was passed around - Body and Soul: Health and Wellness Resources @ Your Library which was funded in whole or in part with federal funds awarded to the University at Buffalo Health Sciences Library from the Department of Health and Human Services, National Institutes of Health, National Library of Medicine. These brochures will be out shortly and reflect the wide variety of health and wellness resources the Library offers as well as help on navigating this information.

She was pleased to announce a new Library logo has been soft launched and trustees will begin to see this coming out.

Hard copies of the final 2012 Facility Assessment Report were available for trustees to take as well as a few CD's. This also has been posted on the Library's trustee website. Individual libraries received their own reports. Ms. Jakubowski reminded all that this is someone's opinion and contains constructive suggestions. At some point, this will be brought back to the Board for further discussion and future planning and will become part of the Library's Strategic Plan. Mr. Connors added, this is a great roadmap for Library facilities going forward; these are recommendations. Further discussion ensued. Mr. Schmidt asked if the final version is significantly different than the draft trustees received previously. Ms. Jakubowski said there were quite a few changes, especially in the Space Use & Facility Recommendation Summary Matrix.

Director Jakubowski referred to the letter sent to local mayors and supervisors correcting the inaccuracies in the resolution regarding the special library district approved by the Erie County Association of Governments noting she had calls from the Mayor of Williamsville, the Clarence Town Board (and has since met with them) and the Mayor of Springville. She feels their eyes have been opened after reading this letter. As mentioned in the Executive Committee report, because of the Erie County Association of Governments inability to include a presentation from the System regarding the district initiative in any of their upcoming meetings, members of the group and other local officials will be invited to attend a library sponsored program where questions can be answered. Trustees will be informed on the dates chosen; she remarked it will be very important to have ACT members involved in these sessions.

Congratulations were offered to Keith Tepas of Williamsville who has received the National Down Syndrome Society's Dan Piper Award for his volunteer work with the Amherst Public Libraries amongst many other things. On motion by Ted Johnson, seconded by Elaine Panty, it was unanimously approved to send a congratulatory letter to Keith Tepas for his accomplishments on behalf of the Board.

The following was submitted by the Director and transmitted to Board members prior to the meeting:

B&ECPL Monthly ReportSeptember 2012

As you will see from this report, the Buffalo and Erie County Public Libraries (B&ECPL) continue to provide a plethora of services to the residents of Erie County, within the confines of the budget. Patron attendance, computer usage and circulation continue to rise. Demand for increased service and service hours continue. Staff and administration are working hard to meet needs and are commended for their extraordinary efforts.

The "Turn the Lights Back On: Flip the Switch for Library Funding" campaign is in full swing. Excellent response is noted with many community groups and agencies distributing postcards to their constituents. Over 5,200 completed postcards were delivered to the County Executive's Office on Tuesday, October 2, 2012. Media coverage has been excellent for the campaign. For coverage information, see Media section of report.

Fundraising remains essential for library programs and activities along with providing additional moneys for collection development. Fundraising initiatives are currently under way. Information will be distributed at the October 18th Board meeting.

- For the month of September, there were 54 programs presented by or arranged by the Children's Programming Team in libraries across Erie County (including Central), attended by a total of 1,197 children and families.
- September 12th Information Services and Outreach Librarians Susan Kriegbaum-Hanks and Brian Glanowski attended the Diversity Job Fair held at the Buffalo Convention Center. Approximately 248 job seekers spoke with library personnel and 23 library card applications were submitted.
- September 13th Information Services and Outreach Librarian Daniel Caufield attended Project Homeless Connect held at the Buffalo Convention Center. Project Homeless Connect is a national program whose events connect the homeless to resource providers. Approximately 228 attendees stopped by the Library's table.
- September 13th Susan Kriegbaum-Hanks conducted a 1-hour instructional session on the Library's job search and employer-related databases at ECC One Stop. The workshop was well received by the 26 staff members and clients of the Buffalo & Erie County Workforce Investment Board Networking Group.
- September 15th marked the beginning of Hispanic Heritage Month. The Niagara Branch is partnering with the Hispanic Heritage Council of WNY in serving as a location for some of the activities recognizing the culture and contribution of Hispanics in the United States, especially Western New York. There was a discussion/lecture held by Major Carlos Benitez on 'Hispanics in the Military' and a program conducted by Explore and More Children's Museum "Mexican Milagros," which explained the role of Milagros in Mexican culture and gave children a chance to make one themselves.
- The Frank E. Merriweather, Jr. Library (MRW) held their 4th Annual "Community Day" on Saturday, September 15th, with a display of cars in the parking lot from members of the Buffalo Antique and Classic Car Club, various information tables from community and health organizations and a community drum circle.
- On September 1st, Mrs. Eva Doyle presented the 16th lecture in her Eye on History series with the topic "How to Prepare for Disasters". Mrs. Doyle presented her 19th lecture in her series on September 29th focusing on teachers in grades 4-12 with the topic "Using African American History in the Classroom". These lectures were both presented at the MRW Library.

- On September 10th, there was a showing of the *Legacy Family Tree* genealogy webinar, "Building a Family from Circumstantial Evidence" in the auditorium at the MRW Library.
- On September 19th, Mrs. Eva Doyle presented a lecture at the East Delavan Library for the community on the "Role of African Americans in the War of 1812".
- On September 15th, Grosvenor Room Librarian Rhonda Konig presented "Getting Started with the 1940 Census" at the Western New York Genealogical Society meeting, which took place at Hamburg High School.
- On September 28th, Rhonda Konig co-presented "How to Research Your House" with Cynthia Van Ness, Director of the Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society Library, at the Preservation Plus conference held by Preservation Buffalo Niagara at the Buffalo and Niagara Convention Center.

- Collection Development staff responded to 519 patron purchase suggestions and 108 staff suggestions in September.
- In September, B&ECPL began participating in a pilot project through the
 Western New York Library Resources Council (WNYLRC) and EBook Library
 (EBL) providing access to over 6,000 nonfiction eBook titles. This consortial
 experiment was developed to combine purchase power between academic and
 public libraries and to purchase materials, developing collections as items are
 used, preventing what is believed to be duplication of holdings amongst
 libraries. B&ECPL Library patrons downloaded 167 EBL titles this month.
- In conjunction with the rare book display, "When Buffalo Burned," Grosvenor Room Librarian Carol Pijacki completed the display: "A Step in Time: Music & Dance in Early 19th Century America," featuring materials from the music and Rare Book Room collections.
- On September 27th, Rare Book Librarian Amy Pickard shared recently conserved materials with members and guests of the Library Foundation of Buffalo & Erie County Board of Trustees. The group surveyed the Ezra Ames portrait of Seth Grosvenor now on display in the War of 1812 exhibit and the William Smith Delineation of the Strata of England and Wales, with a Part of Scotland map (a.k.a. The Map that Changed the World). Conservation of these items was made possible with funds generously donated by the Library Foundation.



- An updated version of Workflows, the software used by staff to manage circulation, acquisitions, and cataloging functions, was successfully installed on the Library's test server. Evaluation and testing will commence in anticipation of upgrading all staff PCs in November.
- A bid award was approved through Erie County Purchasing Department for the Library to acquire a quantity of new HP PRO 3420 All-in-One PCs. The computers will be used to update staff workstations in several RFID (radio frequency identification) converted libraries (increasing staff efficiency) as well as replace dozens of out-of-date staff computers at several libraries in the B&ECPL System. In addition, public computers will be upgraded at the Frank E. Merriweather Jr. Branch Library. The upgrades are made available from a previously approved Board resolution which authorized expenditure for obsolete hardware form the "Designated for Contingencies equipment and technology replacement Fund."
- A new video, How to Download and Install Adobe Digital Editions
 (http://bit.ly/Uea5Ii), was developed by the Technology Training Team. Adobe Digital Editions is a necessary piece of software for reading library eBooks with Nook eReaders. The video is available on the B&ECPL Training Lab's YouTube channel (http://bit.ly/KdRNzH).

- The Technology Training Team conducted 33 public classes for 306 attendees at 16 library locations.
- The Rare Book Room worked with Katherine Walter of the University of Nebraska — Lincoln to include a Whitman manuscript from the B&ECPL Gluck Collection titled Robert Burns as Poet and Person to the University's online Walt Whitman Archive (http://www.whitmanarchive.org). The item was scanned and sent, and will be available to the public through this electronic research and teaching tool. The Library received \$1,000 for this service.
- RFID Update: A total of 21 libraries are now fully up and running using RFID technologies. Three additional libraries are using RFID for circulation at staff stations, with self-checkouts to be installed in upcoming weeks. Collection conversion is under way at the North Collins, Marilla, and Clarence Libraries. Three additional libraries are targeted to be 'live' fully functional RFID sites by the end of 2012.
- Two separate e-mail mass mailings were sent to library users and supporters
 who have "Opted In" to receive communications about fundraising and
 programming. The mailings focused on the "Turn the Lights Back On" restoration of \$3.6 million in funding postcard campaign targeted at Erie County
 Executive Mark Poloncarz and other elected officials. Each mailing reached an
 average of 25,000 e-mail addresses.

4. Funding/Fundraising

Funding:

The Library was recently notified it has been awarded a National Leadership Grant totaling \$319,809 from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). This prestigious award continues the work begun in 2009 with a National Endowment of the Humanities (NEH) Digital Start-Up grant and a programming grant from the NY Council for the Humanities which tested models for creating a digital, searchable index of WNY Depression era resources. The focus of the NEH grant was on the Library's collection and programs at the Library in 2010 and 2011 that connected historical resources, technology and expert panels with public discussion on solutions to similar contemporary community challenges.

The IMLS Grant is a 2-year project, with partners Randforce Associates of the UB Technology Incubator, Cleveland State University Center for Public History & Digital Humanities, UB Center for Urban Studies/Perry Choice Neighborhood Project and the Buffalo Broadcasters Association. The Library will focus on the nature of its digital future, how collections will be impacted by the intersection of new technologies and

public programming, along with developing both local and national perceptions of the B&ECPL.

New York State Construction Grant Applications Submitted

A total of 8 New York State Construction Grant Applications were reviewed and submitted online for NYS Division of Library Development review (more than a week ahead of their deadline). The grant applications requested the full \$641,863 available and then some (costs eligible for grant funding over \$1.2 million). They support projects at the following libraries:

5. Facilities

Central Library Capital Project planning is moving forward. Bids for asbestos
abatement and of vacated 2nd floor space will be released this month with bids
due in November. Abatement is expected to begin this winter and be completed
in early 2013. All work will be closely monitored by the County and personnel

from Watts Architecture & Engineering, a firm with extensive experience monitoring abatement projects. After the space is abated, it will be reconfigured to include a new flexible meeting space for approximately 80 attendees and create space for future collaborations with mission related nonprofits. Additionally, as part of the reconfiguration portion, the 2nd floor public restrooms will be reconfigured and their capacity expanded significantly. Funding from this project comes from a variety of sources including previously approved County funding for abatement and space reconfiguration, a New York State Library Construction Grant and library grant match funds.

- Planning and design for the Central Library elevator project to replace the 1963 vintage escalator system is also under way. Current work centers on locating the elevators in an area that would allow the escalator system to continue to operate until the elevators are ready to replace them and maximize future use of the space freed up by removing the escalators for library program activities. Construction on this project is estimated to begin later in 2013 or early 2014. Funding for the project was included in the County's 2010 adopted capital budget.
- The Children's Space reorganization continues and all tall shelving has been moved from the area which will become additional room for Children's collections and programming. Completion of this project is scheduled for the end of October.

Agenda Item G - Report of the Foundation. Anne Conable reported the Library Foundation of Buffalo & Erie County trustees met on September 27, 2012. They are primarily working on planning and developing fundraising plans for the rest of 2012, moving into 2013, coordinating on the Milestones anniversary and related activities and planning for additional support for rare books and special collections. Also under discussion is reinvigorating the Grosvenor Society as an annual high-end donor group that would be part of the fundraising plan for the future.

Agenda Item H – Public Comment. No one stepped forward with public comment when announced, however, Dr. John Munson spoke up after Executive Session was motioned below and wished to speak. Chair Connors agreed that although he did not speak up during Public Comment on the agenda, he would be permitted to speak at the conclusion of Executive Session. Dr. Munson provided background on his book and stated that some things of his are disappearing at the library while working at the computers, ie. hat, printouts. Mr. Connors stated we will address this with Security staff and attempt to make the Library a better environment for him as a user of the Library System.

Agenda Item I - Unfinished Business. No unfinished business.

Agenda Item J - New Business.

Agenda Item J.1 - 2013 Budget Update. A B&ECPL 2013 Budget Request Operating and Grants - by Line Item Per SAP Structure status as of October 15, 2012 report was distributed

to trustees. Mr. Stone provided an update on County Executive Mark Poloncarz's 2013 Budget in which he recommended \$300,000 in restored funds for the Library. Mr. Stone is working with contracting libraries and Buffalo branch staff to determine what the Library can do with the \$300,000, when \$3.6 million was asked for. The emphasis will be on restoring hours of service. More detail will be available in time for the Budget Hearing sometime in November – perhaps as early as mid next week. The County Executive also recommended, per the Library's request, that the split allocation of County support Interfund Revenue Subsidy and Library Tax be combined into a single Library Tax line. This in and of itself would not increase the overall County property tax rate as the \$2 million Interfund Revenue amount could then be used to offset the County portion of the Property Tax. The split was confusing to the public. The County Executive agreed and we now have a recommended library tax budget of \$22,172.457 and the \$2 million dollar Interfund Revenue Subsidy line amount goes to zero. It does show as a 10.4% increase in the Library Tax, but the actual net increase to the Library is 1.4% (\$300,000). He further discussed the press' confusion on this topic as well as the tax cap, tax base, increased retirement system costs and increased health insurance costs.

The Chair entertained a motion to go into Executive Session at 4:40 p.m. Mr. Johnson made the motion, which was seconded by Ms. Thomas. Approval was unanimous. All members of the staff and public were excused from the room with the exception of Director Jakubowski and Deputy Director Stone. Trustee Thomas exited Executive Session at 4:56 p.m. At approximately 5:15 p.m., on motion by Ms. Leary, seconded by Ms. Panty, the Board ended closed session and returned to public session. No action was taken in Executive Session.

Trustee Schmidt left at 5:15 p.m., at the conclusion of Executive Session.

Dr. John Munson was invited to provide public comment at this time. Please see note under Agenda Item H.

There being no further business, on motion by Ms. Horton with a second by Ms. Panty, the meeting was adjourned at 5:23 p.m.

B&ECPL Monthly ReportOctober 2012

To no surprise, our statistics: circulation, patron visits, programming, computer use, etc. remain strong...growing, even with the reduced hours, services and staff. Residents of Erie County need and use their public libraries regularly. We are at our breaking point, stretching every dollar and using fund balances, as necessary, to supplement funding for basic services. With rising costs, there is simply no more which can be stretched. 2013's budget will prove pivotal in determining whether we are able to sustain the basic library services provided in 2012.

Education on Library budget needs was at full throttle this month with over 7,500 Turn the Lights Back On postcards delivered to the County Executive's office before October 15th. Numerous e-mails and social media posts were sent/posted, along with several presentations done to express the benefits of sufficient funding for libraries. The Turn the Lights Back On website is fully integrated and is also proving effective.

On October 15th, the County Executive responded by recommending an additional \$300,000 in funding be provided to the Library. In addition, at our request, he also recommended the \$2,000,000 in alternate revenue source funds (interfund transfer) be moved/included in the Library's property tax levy. While this is not additional funding, the placement of the funds in the property tax levy clarifies how and by whom the Library is currently funded.

While we are grateful for the additional funding, our quest to seek sufficient funding must not end with the County Executive! The budget is now in the hands of the Erie County Legislators. Patrons, staff and trustees are being asked to contact their local legislator to encourage additional funding be found for the Library. Budget documents including our original budget restoration request of \$3.6 million, along with an updated version that reflects the use of the \$300,000 can be found at http://www.buffalolib.org/content/budget-information/2013-budget.

The Library's 2013 Budget Hearing is scheduled for Thursday, November 15, 2012 at 12:30 p.m. in the Chambers of the Erie County Legislature. Trustees, staff and patrons are encouraged to attend to show support of the Library's budget request.

In addition, and most important, is the 2013 Erie County Budget Public Hearing at 5 p.m. on Monday, November 19, 2012. Public, trustees, friends and staff are being encouraged to speak at this hearing on behalf of the Library.

- Collection Development staff responded to 550 patron purchase suggestions and 131 staff suggestions in October.
- A Babel in a Bag has been assembled for each of the 4 authors scheduled to speak in the 2012/2013 Babel series. Each book bag kit contains 10 copies of one title, as well as author information, a reading guide, and discussion questions. The kits are now available for borrowing.
- This month, 21,605 eBooks circulated to patrons. This compares to 13,760 in October of 2011. This month 273 eBooks were added to the collection.
- In October, patrons downloaded a total of 5,394 Freegal Music titles compared to 4,327 in October of 2011.
- The Library's Subject Guides received 952 unique visitors from 5 countries in October. The most popular Subject Guides included Health; Patent, Trademark, and Copyright; and Immigrants and Refugees.

- A total of 22 libraries are now fully up and running using Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technologies. The Lancaster Public Library went fully 'live' on October 23rd when self-checkout stations and security gates were installed. Two additional libraries (Julia Boyer Reinstein and Alden) are using RFID for circulation at staff stations, with self-checkouts scheduled to be installed in November. Collection conversion is under way at the North Collins, Marilla, and Clarence Libraries. A total of 24 libraries are targeted to be 'live' fully functional RFID sites by the end of 2012.
- A new video, Pinterest: Demonstration and Tutorial on How to Set up an Account (http://bit.ly/SaDwWY), was developed by the Technology Training Team. Pinterest is a social media tool that allows users to create and manage theme-based photo collections and link them to other sites.
- Information Technology and Technology Support staff prepared for a Sirsi
 Symphony upgrade scheduled for Veterans Day weekend. The test server was
 upgraded and preparations were made to remotely deploy the new Sirsi
 WorkFlows client to staff PCs. This upgrade will provide several 'fixes' and
 some functionality upgrades for staff using the Circulation, Acquisitions and
 Cataloging modules.
- Two new web applications were developed by IT Manager Steve Hovey to facilitate staff statistical reporting. The first provides a standardized method to track progress on the Goals associated with the Board-approved Organizational Competencies. The second will facilitate an initiative that will allow authorized staff in community libraries to update portions of their library's web pages. Staff

from the Clarence Public Library will be trained and beta test the applications prior to roll-out for the other libraries.

- The What's Black and White and Read All Over? fundraising event presented by the Library's Young Professionals volunteer group has sold 176 tickets to date and grossed \$24,280. Thank you to the trustees and libraries that purchased tickets or sponsorships. We expect 200 + guests for the Friday, November 16th event at the Lafayette Hotel. The auctions will feature Rare Book reprints, an IPAD, Nook, wine, TV and more. Funds raised will be spread throughout the 37-member Library System to support the expenses associated with the many free services and materials, including books for kids, teens and adults, that have suffered from funding cuts in the last 2 years. We are hoping all libraries purchase 4 tickets in support of the event. Volunteers are needed as well. For more information, call Joy Testa Cinquino at 716-858-7182.
- The Library mailed 2,100 pieces for the 2012 Bucks for Books fundraising campaign. To date, we have 404 donors and \$23,945 in donations. The solicitation piece is also available in all libraries for patrons to make donations.

- The Development and Advocacy Committee met on October 18th to discuss the Black and White event and the Milestones Anniversary fundraising opportunities. The Committee will reconvene in December.
- The Library Director worked collaboratively with the Oishei Foundation and the Community Foundation of Greater Buffalo to submit an application for an ArtPlace grant of \$500,000. The grant, if received, will be used to develop The Space to Create, using the vacated 25,000 square feet of space on the second floor of the Central Library. The Space to Create will develop collaborations with local art and cultural organizations bringing them under one roof to create efficiencies, while providing educational and programming opportunities throughout the Library System.

5. Facilities

- The Kids Space reorganization has met its planned deadlines for 2012. All shelving and collections have been moved in the Popular Materials area and the expansion of the Children's area is finished. Children now have the entire front window section of the Library for programming and activities.
- Ten display panels representing the history of Black Rock were installed at the Niagara Branch on October 25th; four are about the War of 1812 and 6 are about Market Square and the development of the Village of Black Rock. Anne Conable arranged for the display, which was created by the Black Rock Historical Society.
