WHEREAS, upon her retirement, Anna decided to work part-time at a nursing home, and later made a career changing move when she became a Teacher Aide at Buffalo Public School #31; and

WHEREAS, she took immense pride and true devotion in opening her own business, "TRIGGS DAYCARE" and throughout her excellent work rapport at School 31, the school would provide Anna's daycare center with learning materials to her help teach the children; and

WHEREAS, Anna started her Christian journey as a child with her family attending People's Community Church and was baptized by Reverend D.M Byrd; and

WHEREAS, during her storied life and her strong connection with the Lord, Anna would go on to join St. Luke AME Zion Church with her aunt Viola, attended Pilgrim Baptist and then attended Durham Memorial AME Zion where she served as President of the Usher Board, on the Trustee Board and as a Boy Scout Troop Leader; and
