## A RESOLUTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATORS TODARO, LORIGO, GREENE, AND MILLS

## Re: Support for the Help Wanted Act

WHEREAS, America is facing a severe labor shortage as the economy begins to reopen and COVID restrictions are being lifted. Many states are returning to pre-COVID life; and

WHEREAS, the labor shortage is partly responsible for the recent spike in the rate of inflation and for the product shortages we are still experiencing; and

WHEREAS, The US has been comparatively successful in distributing the COVID-19 vaccines as a nation. Roughly $45 \%$ of the population in the United States are now fully vaccinated. In New York State, the percent of the population with at least one dose has exceeded $70 \%$. It is impossible for the government to dictate how people feel about the risks of COVID19. However, as more people become vaccinated and fewer cases of COVID-19 lead to hospitalizations, the fear of COVID-19 will subside; and

WHEREAS, increases in the federal minimum wage and the need to hire workers has led to a general increase in wages across the nation. Now the government needs to step up and encourage people to return to the workforce. Congressman Jacobs has introduced the Help Wanted Act to try and address some of the issue; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires three main goals. That every state reinstates the worksearch requirement for unemployment benefits. This requires unemployment recipients to show proof of a job search to receive benefits. Many states had suspended that requirement during the height of the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Act would further remove a provision from the CARES Act that allows people to collect unemployment benefits after voluntarily leaving their jobs; and

WHEREAS, finally, the Act would prohibit the use of generic concerns about COVID19 as a reason for turning down offers of employment; and

WHEREAS, residents should be encouraged to return to the workforce before marketable skills are lost and they are not able to find employment.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that this honorable body hereby urges the passage of the Help Wanted Act, H.R. 3148; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be sent to the Western New York delegation to the United States Senate and House of Representative, President Joseph Biden, and any other party deemed necessary and proper.
