Honoring Reverend Langdon Hubbard On 20 Years with First Presbyterian Church of East Aurora

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature seeks to honor individuals and institutions of Erie County that enhance the quality of life in the community through their efforts; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Langdon Hubbard is retiring as the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of East Aurora after 20 years of guiding one of the community's oldest churches; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Langdon Hubbard grew up in Washington, D.C. and Greenville, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Langdon Hubbard's first church after ordination was in Salisbury, North Carolina, followed by pastorships in New Brunswick, New Jersey, Chicago, Buffalo and Niagara Falls before coming to East Aurora; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Langdon Hubbard has taken the church beyond the boundaries of East Aurora and has organized mission trips to Honduras, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Chicago, and New York City; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Langdon Hubbard and the church have been staunch supporters of the Rural Outreach Center, FISH, and the Aktion Club of East Aurora; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Langdon Hubbard and his retired minister wife, Janet, have plans to connect with African American congregations in Buffalo and help with children's ministry; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Langdon Hubbard will continue to be involved in the East Aurora community and wants to run a half-marathon in all 50 states and D.C.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Erie County Legislature pauses in its deliberations to honor **Reverend Langdon Hubbard** for twenty years with First Presbyterian Church and wishes him a great retirement.
