Recitals

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the County of Erie (hereinafter, the "Legislature" and "County," respectively), New York, has heretofore duly authorized the financing of various capital projects included in the 2001 Capital Budget of the County, pursuant to the bond resolution adopted

on April 5, 2001 and thereafter amended on November 8, 2001, by the Legislature, and hereinafter referred to; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to provide \$527,000 additional funds for the Reconstruction of the East Church Street Bridge, including \$500,650 expected to be received from the United States of America and/or the State of New York;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all members of said Legislature) AS FOLLOWS:





- Prevent the suppression of reliable evidence of guilt in terrorism cases when law enforcement officials make mistakes in good faith about search and seizure requirements;
- Create the new offenses of criminal facilitation of terrorism and conspiracy to commit terrorism;



A RESOLUTION SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATORS DEBENEDETTI, GREENAN, McCARVILLE, CHASE, CUSACK, RANZENHOFER, WEINSTEIN & LARSON

Whereas, for 17 straight years, the New York State Legislature and Governor have not been able to adopt a new state budget on or before the constitutional deadline of April 1 of each year, and

Whereas, late budgets have resulted in delays in funding for school districts, local governments and not-for-profit organizations, hindering their ability to provide essential services and to accurately draft their own budgets, and

Whereas, delays in the passage of the New York State Budget have made it difficult for Erie County officials to accurately manage the county's budget because of the uncertainties related to potential increases/decreases in state aid to local government, formula-driven programs, and the potential imposition of unanticipated costs from new unfunded state mandates, and

Whereas, legislation has been introduced in the New York State Assembly (A.7714 & A.7715) that would fix the historically flawed budget process, ensure the adoption on an on-time state budget and open the budget process to public review, and

Whereas, the key elements of the Assembly budget reform proposal include:

- Permanently ending the so-called "three men in a room" practice of budget negotiations by opening the process up to public scrutiny, setting strict timelines, establishing reporting and meeting requirements for the budget conference committees including public meetings and written reports. No later than March 15th, both houses of the State Legislature would appoint members to the budget conference committees and subcommittees to begin the process of finalizing the budget in time for the April 1 deadline.
- Establish "Binding Revenue Estimates." The State Comptroller would be required to provide preliminary economic and revenue forecasts on or before March 1st. If an agreement on the economy and revenue were not reached by the statutory deadline of March 10th, the Comptroller would establish a binding revenue number by March 11th that would be the final revenue number upon which the budget would be based.

- Prohibit the State Legislature from considering non-budget bills after April 1st until a budget is adopted.
- Implement a fail-safe mechanism through a constitutional amendment mandating the use of the prior year state budget if no budget is agreed to within 60 days of the April 1st deadline. The Governor would be granted additional powers to control spending and make adjustments for entitlement and revenue shortfalls.
- Enact a sunshine requirement requiring a plain language summary of the final budget to be prepared by the Division of Budget and made available to the Legislature and the public for at least 48 hours prior to the adoption of the budget.

Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Erie County Legislature recognizes the difficulty that the untimely adoption of state budget imposes upon school districts, local governments and not-for-profit organizations, and be it further

WHEREAS, while weighted voting can certainly be described as unfair and unjust, it was recognized as a temporary measure to be set aside once a redistricting plan was to be put in place, and

WHEREAS, Judge Elfvin's order stated that such weighted voting shall be in place "until a redistricting plan shall legally be put in place by the County Legislature... or by [Judge Elfvin]," and

WHEREAS, in a footnote, Judge Elfvin stated that uncertainties and inequities caused his decision to implement weighted voting as a temporary measure; although he stated his intention not to put in place a redistricting plan of his own creation unless a plan was not legally put in place by the Legislature before March 15, 2002, and

WHEREAS, the March 15, 2002 date has passed, and no plan has been legally put in place by the Legislature, and

WHEREAS, weighted voting should be terminated, inasmuch as Judge Elfin's order indicates that he will now put into place his own plan, and

WHEREAS, Judge Elvin, in his order, stated that at the time of his implementation of weighted voting, he was prepared to "proclaim a constitutional plan *here and now*," (emphasis added), thereby allowing for weighted voting to be utilized as a stopgap measure to avoid a situation that would "without doubt, be disastrous to those... engaged in the process of endeavoring to become or to continue as legislators," but clearly indicating his willingness and ability to impose a plan at any time, and

WHEREAS, in the alternative, if the plan adopted by the Legislature is determined by a court to have been legally in place, according to Judge Elfvin's order, weighted voting must be terminated, inasmuch as weighted voting was intended as a temporary measure intended to remove the redistricting issue from the constrictive timeframe associated with the 2001 primary and general elections, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature should dispense with weighted voting at this time,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby recognize Judge Elfvin's 2001 order and the temporary nature of the weighted voting imposition set forth therein, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby declare the weighted voting system to be no longer in effect, and that members are hereby returned to a one-vote per elected legislator status within the Legislature, and be it further

Statement of Erie County Executive Joel A. Giambra

Today I will sign the new Erie County Legislative reapportionment plan enacted with bi-partisan support by Erie County Legislature. I will then direct the Erie County Attorney to submit this plan to Federal District Court Judge John T. Elfvin in compliance of his order to do so before March 15, 2002.

Consistent with the widely-expressed desire for reducing the size and cost of local government, this plan reduces the size of the Erie County legislature from 17 to 15 members. This plan preserves community integrity for Eggertsville, for Lancaster, for East Aurora and for other towns. This plan achieves a historic milestone in fairness to the growing Hispanic community by ending the injustice of splintering that community among four districts.

This plan also effectively strengthens minority representation because two of fifteen districts, rather than two of seventeen districts, will encompass neighborhoods that are historically African-American in population.

This plan is not perfect. The Town of Cheektowaga, which was split among six districts in a previous plan, that Judge Elfvin refused to impose, is still split among five districts. The Buffalo neighborhood of Allentown is still split between two legislative districts. Community continuity is a goal toward which the map drafters strive, but we cannot hold them to a standard of utter perfection.

Ultimately, the citizens of Erie County must have some say in whether they want a smaller legislature. This plan gives the people that opportunity. This reapportionment plan must pass a referendum in November.

I commend the Legislature and its technical staff for formulating this plan, and I am grateful for all the public input I received in four well-attended public hearings I conducted on this issue.

I submit this plan hopeful that the Court will understand that Erie County needs to move forward with reapportionment to achieve community confidence that their government is both efficient and representative.
