The Sardinia Town Board held a work session to discuss other numerous proposed projects and the status of the Town parks in regards to COVID19 concerns. Supervisor Gambino called the work session to order at 9 AM.

Supervisor Gambino stated that the first item to discuss was the bids for the new window blinds for the Town Hall. She stated that she had three bids and that the fourth bid had not come in. The bids were as follows:

- Blind Faith \$13,000.00 with a valance and \$10,500.00 without the valance
- Sewing Unlimited \$19,620.68
- SMWahler Designs \$10,576.89 with a valance and \$8915.15 without the valance

After a brief discussion the board selected Blind Faith bid without the valance for the blinds. **On a motion by Marsh, seconded by Domster, the bid of \$10,500.00 was accepted. Carried, 4 ayes, 0 noes.**

Supervisor Gambino stated that the next item to discuss was a proposal from MRB Group for professional services for the septic system investigations at Veteran's Park and Manion Park. Supervisor Gambino stated that the cost for the services would be \$6,500.00. **On a motion by Domster, seconded by Hochadel, the proposal was accepted as submitted. Carried, 4 ayes, 0 noes.**

Councilman Domster stated that he had two bids for redoing the Town Hall parking lot and the basketball court at Manion Park and was still waiting for the third. He noted that he hoped to have the third by the July meeting.

The Town Board then began a discussion on the Town Parks and Town sponsored events as well as restrictions or precautions that will need to be in place due to concerns over COVID 19. Items discussed included the concerts in the park, the Town wide garage sale, if and when the parks could be opened, cleaning of the facilities, cleaning of equipment such as picnic tables or the playgrounds, whether or not to rent shelters and whether or not to allow baseball activities to resume. After a lengthy discussion the following items were agreed on.

- The parks will open by July 9th, 2020.
- The playground will remain closed and Superintendent Hopkins will get signs to post near the playgrounds.
- Denny Dick and Dave Kibler will be hired at a rate of \$15.00 each to clean the bathrooms and the shelters.
- The Music in The Park will be postponed two weeks in hopes of larger gathering numbers being approved by the State.
- The Town will not be sponsoring the Town Wide Garage sale this year however residents may have sales if they would like to.
- Current shelter reservations will be honored however in order to help promote social distancing new rentals will not be taken for this year.
- The Sardinia Methodist Church was given permission to use shelter 5 for Sunday morning services as needed as requested at the June 11th Town Board meeting.
- At this time due to restrictions from the State as well as other concerns surrounding COVID 19 it was agreed that Muckdogs baseball activities would not be allowed to resume at this time in the Town Parks.

On a motion by Marsh, seconded by Domster, the above mentioned items were approved. Carried, 4 ayes, 0 noes.

Supervisor Gambino stated that she will need to move the day of the August regular Town Board meeting for August 13th to August 6th. The Board agreed to move the meeting.

Councilman Marsh noted that the new electric poles have been installed in Chaffee.

Councilman Hochadel noted that he hoped to have more information for the new sign at the Town Hall by the July meeting.

Lastly Supervisor Gambino updated the board on the potential walking path at Veteran's Park.

There being no further business to come before the Board, on a motion by Councilman Hochadel, seconded by Councilman Domster, the meeting was adjourned at 10:03 AM. Carried 4 ayes, 0 noes.
